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1	(3) Statewide coordination of suicide prevention efforts is
2	necessary to ensure high levels of collaborative leadership, effectiveness,
3	and continuous improvement;
4	(4) An effective, evidence-based strategy is necessary to
5	increase knowledge about and access to suicide prevention, intervention, and
6	postintervention resources for all Arkansans;
7	(5) Intentional leadership, survivor input, and capacity-
8	building, policy development, and alignment of services for high-risk sectors
9	<u>are needed;</u>
10	(6) A seamless system of support and follow-up coordination for
11	suicide attempt survivors and situationally high-risk individuals is needed;
12	(7) The rate of suicide in Arkansas is presently out-pacing the
13	nation and increasing year to year; and
14	(8) The absence of a suicide prevention program authority in
15	Arkansas is a major threat to public health and welfare.
16	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the Injury
17	Prevention Division of the Department of Health be designated the program
18	authority to receive and solicit funding as appropriate to provide adequate
19	funding in support of an effective and staffed statewide suicide prevention
20	program.
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22	20-45-302. Creation and purpose.
23	(a) There is established the "Arkansas Suicide Prevention Council".
24	(b) The purpose of the council is to serve as a central body on
25	suicide prevention efforts across the state, including without limitation:
26	(1) Setting priorities for statewide, data-driven, evidence-
27	based, and clinically-informed suicide prevention in Arkansas;
28	(2) Providing a public forum to examine the current status of
29	suicide prevention and intervention policies, priorities, and practices;
30	(3) Identifying interested parties, community, state, and
31	national prevention providers and stakeholders for collaboration and devising
32	a system of gathering data and other information to ensure coordination of
33	suicide prevention resources and services throughout Arkansas;
34	(4) Assisting private, nonprofit, and faith-based entities,
35	including without limitation coalitions, foundations, initiatives, churches,
36	veterans groups, substance abuse recovery groups, senior adult organizations,

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1	grief support groups, injury prevention groups, and other groups to enhance
2	suicide prevention and survivor support efforts; and
3	(5) Aiding in the development of evaluation tools and data
4	collection for use in reporting suicide prevention efforts to the public.
5	(c) Within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this act, there
6	shall be appointed to the council no more than twenty-three (23) members,
7	<u>including:</u>
8	(1) A representative of the Office of the Attorney General, to
9	be designated by the Attorney General;
10	(2) A representative of the Division of Behavioral Health
11	Services of the Department of Health, to be designated by the head of the
12	Division of Behavioral Health Services;
13	(3) A representative of the Department of Education, to be
14	designated by the Director of the Department of Education;
15	(4) A representative of the Division of Youth Services of the
16	Department of Health, to be designated by the head of the Division of Youth
17	<u>Services;</u>
18	(5) A representative of Arkansas Children's Hospital, to be
19	designated by the Director of Arkansas Children's Hospital;
20	(6) A representative of law enforcement, to be designated by
21	Director of the Department of Arkansas State Police;
22	(7) A representative from higher education, to be designated by
23	the Director of the Department of Higher Education;
24	<u>(8) A representative from kindergarten through grade twelve (K-</u>
25	12) education, to be designated by the Arkansas Education Association;
26	<u>(9) A representative from an employee assistance program or</u>
27	human resources in the private sector, to be designated by the Governor;
28	(10) A licensed mental health professional, to be designated by
29	<u>the Governor;</u>
30	(11) A representative of substance-abuse treatment providers, to
31	<u>be designated by the Governor;</u>
32	(12) A representative of primary medical care providers, to be
33	designated by the Governor;
34	(13) A representative of first responders, to be designated by
35	<u>the Governor;</u>
36	<u>(14) A representative from a hospital with an on-site emergency</u>

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1	department, to be designated by the Governor;
2	(15) A hospital-based social worker, to be designated by the
3	<u>Governor;</u>
4	(16) An elected coroner, to be designated by the Governor;
5	(17) An active member or veteran of any branch of the United
6	States military, to be designated by the Governor;
7	(18) A family member of a person who died by suicide, to be
8	designated by the Governor;
9	(19) A person who has attempted suicide, recovered, and is now
10	thriving, to be designated by the Governor;
11	(20) A representative of the suicide prevention nonprofit
12	community, to be designated by the Governor;
13	(21) A representative of the Arkansas Prevention Network, to be
14	designated by the Director of the Arkansas Prevention Network;
15	(22) A representative from an interfaith organization, to be
16	designated by the Governor; and
17	(23) The Chair of the Arkansas Youth Suicide Prevention Task
18	Force, or his or her designee.
19	(d) The council shall elect annually two (2) cochairs, a vice chair,
20	and a secretary who will serve as an executive board.
21	(e)(l) The council shall establish a charter and bylaws within ninety
22	(90) days of the first meeting.
23	(2) A quorum for conducting business is one-half (1/2) of the
24	appointed members.
25	(f)(1) The council shall meet at least four (4) times each year.
26	(2) The council shall meet at times and
27	places that the co-chairs deem necessary, but no meeting shall be held
28	outside the state.
29	(3) Special meetings may be held at the call of the co-chairs,
30	<u>as needed.</u>
31	(g)(1) The appointed members of the council shall serve staggered
32	terms of four (4) years with no more than two (2) contiguous terms.
33	(2) If a vacancy occurs in an appointed position, the vacancy
34	shall be filled for the unexpired term by an appointment made in the same
35	manner as the original appointment.
36	(h) Appointments shall:

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1	(1) Represent persons of different ethnic backgrounds;
2	(2) Include members from each of Arkansas's four (4)
3	congressional districts; and
4	(3) Include members with expertise from groups associated with
5	high suicide rates and suicide attempts.
6	(i)(1) The members of the council shall serve without compensation but
7	may seek reimbursement for travel expenses to and from meetings of the
8	<u>council.</u>
9	(2) The expense reimbursement shall be paid by the Department of
10	Health from moneys available for that purpose.
11	(j) The Department of Health shall provide staff and programmatic
12	support for the council to the extent that funding is available.
13	(k) The Department of Health is the designated agency for the purposes
14	of suicide prevention and related state and federal programmatic and funding
15	applications.
16	(1) Within the first year of its creation, the council shall make
17	recommendations to the General Assembly on staffing and funding needs to
18	implement an effective statewide suicide prevention program.
