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

#### **Advice for Parents**



Parents are strongly advised to check in regularly on their child's progress. Here are some suggestions to make this easy to do.

- 1. Every student has a white assignment book. They should be filling out this assignment book on a daily basis. Ask your child to show you their assignment book each evening. If a class has no homework, the student is asked to write NONE instead of leaving it blank.
- 2. Check on Google Classroom. Ask your student to sign into their Google Classroom account. There is a page with an assignment due calendar, as well as separate classroom pages for each course. Often, assignments are listed, as well as due dates, and materials that can be reviewed or downloaded.
- 3. Check School tool weekly. Most teachers keep their gradebooks updated on School tool so that you can see missing assignments. If you don't have a School tool account, contact Kathy Troy in Guidance.
- 4. Feel free to contact (email or phone) any teacher you feel you need to speak with concerning your child's progress.

#### When does DeWitt Open its Doors?

It is important that there is proper adult supervision whenever there are children in or around DeWitt Middle School. DeWitt opens its doors for students at 8:00 a.m. Please do not drop your child off before that time. The school doors are locked after bus drop off times and you or your child must press the front door button to alert the main office.

C.A.R.R.O.T. P.I. is the acronym that Guidance would like to use to highlight the character traits we practice and demonstrate here at DeWitt, and hopefully in our everyday lives. It stands for Compassion, Adaptability, Respect, Responsibility, Optimism, Tolerance, Perseverance, Initiative.

Each month the Guidance Department plans on selecting a character trait to focus on. With the help of recommendations from teachers and staff, each month we will recognize students throughout each grade level who have demonstrated these character traits.

It is our intent that CARROT PI will expound on HOME ideals through visual aids (bulletin boards, digital display at Front of School etc), curriculum (via certain lesson plans within HOMEbase and/or class), and recognition of students on their positive behaviors.

For the first month (October), we focused on the character trait of **Respect**.

- Every table will have a captain, who will make sure that everyone cleans up their messes.
- At Dewitt, we compost, recycle and yes, even throw some items in the trash. Make sure you know what goes where.



# 2019-2020 Student Voice Council



DeWitt Middle School offers students the opportunity to participate and have a voice in the decisions that are made at the school. Student representatives from each Homebase attend monthly meetings. Below are the details that outline the functioning and expectations of the organization.

#### **Behavior Expectations:**

- 1. **Respect yourselves and each other** *it's ok to disagree, just please do so respectfully.*
- 2. When it's a person's turn to talk give them your full attention *no side conversations... Don't talk over other people...*
- 3. **Keep an open mind** when listening, discussing and brainstorming.

#### Goals:

- To strengthen DeWitt's sense of community by giving students opportunities to voice their thoughts, opinions and ideas
  - Build awareness throughout the DeWitt community of student thoughts,
     opinions and ideas
- Provide students with civic engagement opportunities
  - Build skills that will allow you to be strong civically minded citizens as you get older

#### **Student Representative Roles:**

- Report to monthly meetings and press conferences on time, with an open mind, and be ready to collaborate with your SVC peers
  - Class comes 1st ...
- Act as a representative to your HOMEbase:
  - Collect thoughts, opinions, and ideas from HOMEbase peers to share with the
     Council
  - Following meetings, report meeting summaries to HOMEbases

#### **Press Conferences:**

- Typically once a month
- 1 period long
- A panel of rep volunteers (6-8 students)
  - Pose student-generated questions to admin and/or school staff surrounding a topic(s) brought up by students
  - Questions will be provided to the panel
  - Note-taking encouraged
  - Appropriate follow-up questions encouraged
- School administrator(s), teachers and/or other staff will attend depending on the topic(s)
