I want to thank all of you for your support during this school year, especially the communication; whether it's concerns, suggestions, volunteering, and/or participating. Your interest and feedback continue to improve our learning environment to fulfill our goal of being an excellent middle school. As we begin the countdown to June, I want to encourage each of you to continue your involvement and participation in the teaching and learning process.

discussed ways of reducing the anxiety of state exams by doing fun, celebratory events the day before the exams. We will do mojos with students in the cafeteria in the morning. As parents/guardians/caregivers, we encourage you to support your child during the testing periods. The District will be sending out more information regarding changes in the tests this year and parent options.

Since this is the first year of the putting a device in every student's hand, it has not been without some challenges and unforeseen issues that have been brought to our attention. We appreciate the fact that these devices have been an enhancement to classroom instruc-

tion, from online research, to interactive learning apps, to class-room and homework assignments, to flip classroom activities and connection to the global world we live in. We will reflect on the use of chromebook by using a survey to get feedback from students, staff and parents.

One of the last items that I would like to share is the subject of backpacks. We have discussed this subject at length with supporting details among staff. As part of our plan, we would like to raise awareness by talking to students about research for carrying heavy backpacks. In order to make any change in our student's habits and behaviors, both school and home must take responsibility for informing and raising awareness. In addition, staff will

periodically have students organize their backpacks and arrange them according to morning and afternoon classes. A link you can share is:



New Immunization Requirement for 7th Grade Students as of 9/1/2016:



(MenACWY vaccine; brand names Menactra or Menveo) should be administered to all adolescents at age 11 or 12 years for school attendance. National Junior Honor Society

National Junior Honor Society is an organization that fosters and promotes the growth of student scholarship, service, leadership, citizenship and character. Students with a cumulative average of 3.5 or above will be invited to apply for membership to NJHS. However, students who are

invited to apply to NJHS are not guaranteed entry.

Selection is based on a student's demonstration of initiative, leadership, good character and citizenship.

Students who participate in NJHS are required to complete 5 hours of community service before the start of 8th grade. During the school year, students are required to complete 2.5 hours of community service each quarter, as well as attend bi-weekly meetings. Students are also expected to participate in NJHS activities, fund-raisers and

initiatives throughout the year.

Applications for National Junior Honor Society will be available in the guidance office starting March 8th, and are due back to the guidance office by April 5th. Applications must be complete and signed by both the student and the parent/guardian. **Late applications will not be accepted.**

Voyage à Québec!

For February break, 39 ICSD middle school French students traveled to Québec City, Canada. The five-day trip was led by DeWitt French teacher Rebecca Stevenson, with chaperones Michele Morse, Kathy Troy and Gilbert Antoine.

The adventure started at 6 am on Friday February 12. Nine hours later, the charter bus arrived in time for a walking tour of Vieux Québec. Blue skies accompanied the bitter cold, but all were glad to stretch their legs! At the end of this long travel day, students were matched with French-speaking host families who included Ithaca students in family meals and activities every night of their stay.

Saturday saw record low temperatures, but the group stayed indoors for a very educational presentation of the history of Québec, and an incredible military demonstration. Convincing actors in historical dress taught students to load muskets and cannons and learn

how hard life was for soldiers and civilians in the 17th century. Later, at lunch, everyone got to order their food in French! Then it was on to the Basilica of Sainte Anne with its sparkling stained glass and incredible architecture. A stop at Albert Gilles copper museum gave everyone a chance to create their own work of art, and a final stop at the magnificent Montmorency Waterfalls capped off the day.

Students and teachers braved the cold on Sunday to meet the beautiful sled dogs that guided them through the woods outside of Ouébec City. What an adventure! Red cheeks and cold feet testified to the bitter temperatures, but it was impossible to resist the opportunity to ride and drive a dog sled! Lunch warmed everyone up, lumberjack style at a sugar shack, and there was music and dancing too! Students learned how maple syrup is made and had a chance to sample the famous maple taffy on snow. Then, back to town for the closing day of the annual Carnaval

festival, where crowds of families filled the streets. Students joined in for an afternoon full of music, entertainment, giant sled runs and more

Monday was sunny and still very cold. Students boarded an ice-breaker ferry to cross the frozen St. Lawrence River for a spectacular view of the city. Then a 2-hour visit to a local school followed, where fun activities and a pizza party encouraged lively conversations in French and English. Then it was on to visit the famous Ice Hotel, and back to Québec City for leisure time in the city's oldest shopping district and UNESCO World Heritage site, le Petit Champlain. Finally, the day ended with hot chocolate and spectacular toboggan sledding on the famous Glissades. It was hard to believe our trip was over!

On Tuesday February 16, students said "au revoir" to their host families and boarded the bus for the long ride home. It was a wonderful, unforgettable trip!




