Message From The Principal

Dear Parents/Guardians and Families of the DeWitt Learning Community,

I can't believe it's Spring Break already for the 2017-18 school year. Where has the time gone? I guess the old adage "time flies when you are having fun" best describes this school year.

I want to begin by thanking each and everyone of you who has participated and/or supported us (students and staff) this school year. We know given the busy lives we leave, it's not always easy to squeeze in a few moments to share the educational experience of your child,

whether it's academic, athletic, fine and performing arts, or just a conference to stay connected. Your involvement and family engagement is the key to our success at DeWitt, and we thank you.

As we prepare for the final phase of the school year, I want to pause and say how proud I am of the students and parents support for expressing their perspective in the March 14 National School Walkout. While we recognize that there are multiple perspective and this event does not reflect all of our students; however, it does reflect our young people exercise of their free speech. In addition, taking a stand and action in something you believe in is the beginning of participatory democracy. Ithaca City School District is focusing more on how we provide choice and voice to our students in our learning spaces. DeWitt is striving on a daily basis to create opportunities in the teaching and learning process for these experiences.

In addition, we have had conversations about school safety during our HOMEbase time. We surveyed students to get feedback on how safe they feel at DeWitt as well as the staff. We are taking the results to improve our safety procedures and create scenarios during our drills to reassure our students and staff on what to do and how to respond. ICSD is reviewing the entrances to each building, installing phones in each classroom, and using Navigate Preparedness program to support any emergency in each building. The program has a picture of every room, hallway, accountable for students and staff and initiate alarm if needed. This system will provide real time information to building leaders and first responders in the event of a lockdown or other emergency situation. Most of you know the biggest influence and/or impact in educational practice occurs this time of year. Yes, the New York State 3-8 ELA/Math testing will be in April and May of this year respectively. However, the test has been reduced from three days to two days as part of a statewide effort to improve overall State assessments. In addition, New York State proposal for ESSA (Every Student Succeed Act) was approved by the Department of Education last year to initiate testing changes and other Statewide initiatives. One of the proposed goal is that each District must have 95% participation rate in the NYS assessments. All to say, if your child takes the NYS Assessments, help us to be supportive in preparation and planning to make sure each student is physically, emotionally, and mentally ready on the day of the test.

Other things to consider as we bring closure to the year are Spring concerts and athletic contests, school trips, and grade 8 promotion. Make sure you check the calendars for these important dates to continue your involvement and support of our students to the very end.

In closing, on behalf of the staff and students, we welcome and value your feedback. It is very important to us as we continue to improve our instructional delivery and creating a relevant, positive, engaging, nurturing learning environment for ALL of our students. Teamwork makes the dream works!

Our Our School Supply Closet is in Need of Supplies!

At one time or another, nearly everyone has found themselves lacking a pencil, ruler, notebook, or other important item for school—whether through forgetfulness, carelesness, or an inability to acquire the item in the first place.

If any of the above describes you—or a student you know take note of the School Supply Closet, a free-to-students service run by **Penny Boynton**, DeWitt's Family Liaison.

The closet runs on a "pass-it-on" gift philosophy. If any student, for any reason, needs a school supply, that student can stop by Penny's office (or browse the auxiliary supply cart located just outside her office—her door opens into the cafeteria) and take whatever supplies are needed. The pass-it-on part is this: students who have the means whether now or at any time in the future—are asked to give back to the closet. So, a student could take a pencil one day,but give back with a three-ring binder a day later, a year later, or still later as an adult. The most popular items in the closet are index cards, colored pencils, markers, and loose-leaf notebook paper. Other perennially popular supplies include spiral notebooks, three-ring binders, pocket folders, and binder dividers. Backpacks are also a desired item in the closet, and students can trade backpacks in, if their tastes or needs change.

The PTA provides the closet with funding for some items, but students' families are encouraged to donate extra supplies to ensure that the closet is always stocked. Please help us meet the needs of all of our students!

Hello, I am Nathan Taylor the new Technology and Engineering Teacher at DeWitt. This is my first year teaching after graduating from SUNY Oswego and advising TSA. So What is DeWitt TSA up too?

The DeWitt TSA has been working together since October to prepare for the upcoming Connecticut State competition that is April 28th and the National Competition in Atlanta, Georgia on June 21st-26th. The students have been working hard on their individual and team events in school, after school, Tuesdays till 5:30 pm, and Thursdays till 8pm. The events that

the students have been working on are website design, programming, animation, structural design, CO2 cars, and VEX robotics to name a few. There are over 30 events and DeWitt is participating in 95% of them. The DeWitt team has 22 members with 15 boys and 7 girls.





Dances at DeWitt

The School Dance schedule will be announced. All dances are held on Friday evenings from 7 to 9pm. During ski season, dances are on Saturdays. Dances are held in the gymnasium with half the gym

dedicated to the dance, and the other half open for basketball or other similar activities. A live DJ plays music on the dance area of gym. Music is reviewed for middle school by our DJ who is a staff member at DeWitt.

- A DJ plays music throughout the dance.
- Tickets are \$4 and can be purchased during lunch on the Thursday and Friday prior to the dance, and at the door before the dance.
- Dress code is the same as the school day. Soft-soled shoes help preserve the gym floor.
- Food and drinks are sold at the dance. Prices vary from 25¢ to \$1.
- Friends of middle school age from other schools are welcome to attend with a DeWitt student. However, you must sign them up during lunch no later than Thursday before the dance, otherwise they will not be able to attend.
- Once students arrive they cannot leave and come back unless a parent is with them.
- Dances are chaperoned by staff members and parent volunteers. Parent chaperones are always needed. Please let the Main Office know if you can help.

Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up

When dropping off or picking up your child at DeWitt, please make use of the drop-off/pick-up area at the North exit (parking lot exit).

Please follow the one-way direction of cars to create a smooth flow of traffic, and be patient during the morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up. In order to keep the flow of traffic moving, it is important that drivers pull up as far as possible in the drop-off area.

It is critical to pay attention to cars moving in all directions and, more importantly, check for pedestrians crossing the lanes. Thank you for your consideration.

National Junior Honor Society

National Junior Honor Society is an organization that fosters and promotes the growth of student scholarship, service, leadership, citizenship and character. Incoming 8th graders with a cumulative average of 3.5 or above will be invited to apply for membership to NJHS. Qualifying students will be notified in writing that they are eligible to apply. However, students who are invited to apply to NJHS are not guaranteed entry. Selection is based on a student's demonstration of initiative, leadership, good character and citizenship.

Students who participate in NJHS are required to complete 5 hours of community service before the start of 8th grade. During the school year, students are required to complete 2.5 hours of community service each quarter, as well as attend bi-weekly meetings. Students are also expected to participate in NJHS activities, fund-raisers and initiatives throughout the year. Applications for National Junior Honor Society will be available in the guidance office starting April 18th, and are due back to the guidance office by May 4th. Applications must be complete and signed by both the student and the parent/ guardian. Late applications will not be accepted.
