# An Interview with Rev. Sharon Voelker

On June 4th we welcomed the Rev. Sharon Voelker as our Priest-in-Residence to St. Stephens. Sharon and I talked this week about her journey to the priesthood and the decision to postpone full- time retirement a little longer to join us. Lucky us!



When Sharon and her late husband Ray lived in Phoenix, they spoke about moving back to Michigan to retire with their children nearby. After Ray passed away Sharon made the move, and while driving across the country, she and the Holy Spirit had a conversation. The Holy Spirit thought Sharon should become a priest and Sharon thought the idea was preposterous. Moving into her new home, reconnecting with friends and frequently seeing her grandchildren was what she planned. But it is difficult to deny the voice. She spoke to her priest. In Saginaw. He answered "I'm not surprised."

A few months later she found herself in an intense three-year program instituted by the Diocese of Eastern Michigan in conjunction with the Seminary of the Southwest. Our program was the Coppage Gordon School for Ministry, the forerunner of the present Academy for Vocational Leadership, led by the

dioceses of Eastern Michigan, Michigan, and Western Michigan.

Her first placement as a Transitional Deacon was with St. John's, Saginaw. She was ordained priest at St. Albans on April 20, 2012 by the Rt. Rev. Todd Ousley Bishop of the Diocese of Eastern Michigan. She remained there until she retired in 2017.

Michigan always felt like home base. Her son and his family live in Shelby Township and her daughter and her family are in Hemlock, west of Saginaw. She has six beautiful grandchildren who live nearby. When asked to help at St. Stephens as a supply priest it felt comfortable. "My son and daughter-in-law were married at St. Stephens. My granddaughter was baptized here. There was a familiarity to St. Stephens. Good memories." She also said, "There is a good vibe. The people, the love, the feeling of family. It is a very strong vibe." She kept an open mind when approached about being Priest-in-Residence and the Holy Spirit said "Take it."

I asked Sharon what is the greatest reward in being a priest and she said pastoral care, being able to help when someone needs it. "Holding someone's hand, listening to someone's troubles. "I can't fix anything. But I can listen and often that's what is needed."

Sharon hopes her presence here will develop a good strong foundation and a positive direction as we go forward. She urges us to take our time with the process. It is God's process. She closed the interview by saying she is pleased to be with us. We are very pleased to have her.

### **Holy Conversations**

We are off to a great start, having held 5 wellattended sessions with over 60 attendees. The purpose of the Conversations was to find out how folks feel about St. Stephen's, what might make us even better, and how we might attract more younger members.

Attendees were a good cross-section of our core membership. Through very candid conversations we heard that St. Stephen's is a vital part of your lives. You strongly desire to reverse our downward membership trend; you know doing so will not be easy and will require some significant changes. You are creative as evidenced by the many ideas generated, and you are willing to help us change for the better as God asks of us.

We are now digesting your input, and assessing who to speak with next in order to get the broadest input. We will be doing some one-onone or small group sessions to fill gaps in our coverage, and explore some ideas a bit deeper. Targeted will be young adults, kids, Rev. Sharon, homebound, and perhaps some folks that left the church. Also, folks that couldn't make it to a Conversation that wish to share their thoughts should let us know so we can talk. And, if you attended a session and have new ideas, let us know. It will never be too late for good ideas. [Us = Dave Stein, Pat Wojas and Don Ingersoll]

Several suggested improvements were offered that could be done now. We will be passing these through the Vestry to those who can evaluate and address them. Some opportunities are in the areas of communication, pastoral care, improving the sound in the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall, managing the duration of "The Peace," and increasing social activities.

These will improve our Church lives, but won't change the membership trend. For that we will need set up teams to further explore potentially major lines of effort. Ideas were raised in several broad areas: better tailoring activities to young

### **Keeping Up the Building & Grounds**

Buildings and Grounds is back in action again for the summer season. The Clydesdales have recovered from last year's projects.

During the winter, the dishwasher was repaired. The roof was repaired, but not to our satisfaction, and 20% of the money was not paid. So that is still on the list. The alarm system had its yearly checkup.

There were new locks installed on the 3 doors, with lock boxes for access to the building. We had over 95 keys out with the old system, and only about 50 were returned. 45 keys lost in cyberspace did not sit very well with many people. We have 11 keys out now and are monitored by the Key Czar (yours truly). No more keys will be given out. Only a code to the lock box. And on the doors, all the latches and rods were

And on the doors, all the latches and rods were cleaned and repaired, so the doors open and close like they are supposed to.

The furnace filters were changed and all the preventive maintenance on the 8 furnaces were done also. One is in real bad shape, and will need replacing in the near future. A heat vent was added to the Narthex area, will help some to keep it warmer. And in the parish hall, we have 9 out of 12 vent defuses installed on the main heat trunk line. It has made a HUGE difference for that room. The other 3 will be installed in the next week.

Sharon got moved into her office, the desk was moved for her, 2 bookcases were removed and 5-7 pictures were hung on the walls. She is happy now.

Jackie and Don did some major cleanup around the front sign and attended to the plants and shrubs.

And the good news, Phil Pierce, aka. "Phil the Magnificent", along with Pat Wojas, got our church insurance revamped. We will be saving almost 50% in premiums with more coverage by changing companies. Sure wish someone thought of this about 10 years ago. That is why we are the Clydesdales of St. Stephens.

We are reviewing everything and saving where we can. Your next report will be forthcoming in the next few months.



| Revenue Shortfall    | \$ (8,911)    |

Overall revenues are short of our 2019 plan by (7.1)%. Expense control, for example the delayed hiring of our full-time Rector, has offset this shortfall, but the effect is only temporary. Together we can extinguish this shortfall and end the year in the green! The Vestry is managing expenses and as a Parish Family we can commit to maintain our pledge commitments, especially through the summer months.
