



isitors participate in the "Flight to Freedom," a storytelling re-enactment of the harrowing journey of slaves between 1840 and 1863. Though not a railroad at all, but a dangerous, exhausting trail over hundreds of miles, fleeing slaves sought refuge in safe houses owned by abolitionists. Visiting passengers on this "underground railroad" travel a heart-thumping, realistic path with their guide, hide from bounty hunters, cross the Ohio River, and finally come to "Midnight," the code name for Detroit. They take safe haven at the First Congregational Church of Detroit as they move on to -Freedom! Freedom!

This is an unforgettable experience for the whole family. The group rate for admission is \$10 for adults, \$8 for youth and seniors. *The tour does* involve many steps and uneven terrain.
