Powerful Conversations

hope you've enjoyed getting to know the several "Outreach Agencies of the Month," and their representatives who have joined us during and after worship. Hearing a personal story, imagining the situation, encouraging and supporting real ministries – that's what we've been about on each of these featured Sundays. The interactions we've had with leaders from CCRT, Oakland County Foster Care and Mai Family Services bring us closer to our community.

Soon you'll be hearing from me and the Vestry, about additional ways to get even closer. Should I interject an ad for deodorant or breath-mints now? Well, how about a verse of Scripture:

[After the Resurrection, Jesus told his disciples,] "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

This familiar quotation will be read in all churches on May 28, as part of the Ascension story. Right after saying this, Jesus leaves for his place "at the right hand of God the Father." That departure, the growing apart, usually gets our attention as we imagine the trauma that the disciples felt, watching him go

up...up... and away.

But not entirely away: The Holy Spirit, sent



by Jesus, enables all sorts of amazing things to happen when this bunch of hesitant-yet-hopeful Christians really start doing their mission. Indeed, they will be his witnesses to the ends of the earth. And we count ourselves among them, as the instructions are passed from one generation to the next. How does all that happen? Most frequently, by conversation.

On May 28, "Ascension Sunday," let's take some time for holy conversation – during church and afterwards in fellowship. I will offer some instructions for doing so, at the time. But know that (like the Ascension itself), our mission is awaiting further activity with God's help. We are being prepared and guided by the Holy Spirit to "seek and serve Christ in all persons" as part of an on-going, transformative action plan for our church. The talks from and with our Outreach Agency partners demonstrate the importance of caring, listening, engagement with our neighbors.

Where might the Holy Spirit be leading you, for service toward those in our church? And how about, to those outside the church?

Which possibilities really capture your imagination and your passion? Conversations will be popping up all over, and we'll be growing closer in the process.

Summer Youth Trips

This June, the J2A and YAC groups will be traveling in opposite directions for faith-filled adventures. 

Crafting Kindness

Thank you for your generosity and support of Crafting Kindness. Recently, two boxes filled with dresses for young girls and knitting yarn for the women staying at the convent began their journey to Haiti. The shipment will arrive at Agape Flights (in Florida) this week.

Agape Flights will complete the delivery to Haiti, as space is available, usually within a week of receipt. Agape Flights serves 375 missionary families sharing the love of Christ in Haiti, the Bahamas, and the Dominican Republic.

Agape flights does not require payment for the shipment, but does request the recipient pay a portion of the flight costs. Your donations to Crafting Kindness will enable us to donate in full, both the recipient fees and Agape's costs to ship to Haiti.

The money raised above the cost of this delivery will be used for future postage and additional supplies needed throughout the year.
