

February 18, 2018 **THE FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT**HOLY EUCHARIST AT 8:00 & 10:00 A.M.

WORSHIP DURING LENT is deliberately subdued. No flowers are placed on the altar during the season, and our gold and silver vessels are replaced by locally-made pottery. Colorful hangings become plain, and there is an emphasis upon repentance and spiritual renewal throughout the services. In these ways, we recall Jesus' fasting in the wilderness, and anticipate the joyful return of colors and "Alleluias" at Easter.

IN THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH all baptized people may receive Holy Communion regardless of age. However, this is the Lord's Table and not ours, and no one who comes to the altar seeking Christ will be turned away. Both the consecrated bread and wine are offered to all. Some may decline either the wine or the bread or come to the altar rail for a blessing.
