<u>The Ending of a Pastoral Relationship</u> with The Rev. Laurel Dahill and The Ven. Keith Mackenzie

Laurel: Friends, as you know, we are gathered today not only to worship God, in Christ, through the Holy Spirit, but also to say Good-bye to your priest and rector after nearly six years together.

Susan: I first led worship here on September 15, 2012; and on October 11, I was inducted by Bishop Gibbs as rector of St. Stephen's. I have, with God's help and to the best of my abilities, exercised this trust, accepting its privileges and responsibilities. After prayer and careful consideration, it now seems to me that I should leave this charge, and I publicly state that my tenure as rector of St Stephen's ends effectively on this day.

Susan presents several items and returns her keys to the Warden. Katy Allen makes a presentation on behalf of the congregation. Others may speak/present.

Laurel: Do you, the people of St Stephen's, recognize and accept the conclusion of this pastoral relationship? *People:* We do.

Will you continue to pray for one another, speaking with charity about the time that is past, and engaging the transitions that lie ahead of you with trust in God? *People and Priest:* We will.

Keith: The Bishop has sent the following message:

"Dear people of St Stephen's: As you move forward, the Wardens and Vestry will be working closely with Jim Gettel, Canon for Congregational Life, and others in the Bishop's Office, to help facilitate this time of transition. With the Bishop's oversight, a process will be put in place to guide parish leadership toward a time when a new incumbent may be installed."

Susan: Let us pray. *The departing rector and the congregation then say together*

O God, you have bound us together for a time as priest and people to work for the advancement of your kingdom in this place: We give you humble and hearty thanks for the ministry which we have shared in these years now past. *Silence*

We thank you for your patience with us despite our blindness and slowness of heart. We thank you for your forgiveness and mercy in the face of our many failures. *Silence*

Especially we thank you for your never-failing presence with us through these years, and for the deeper knowledge of you and of each other which we have attained. *Silence*

We thank you for those who have been joined to this part of Christ's family through baptism. We thank you for opening our hearts and minds again and again to your Word, and for feeding us abundantly with the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of your Son. *Silence*

Now, we pray, be with those who leave and with us who stay; and grant that all of us, by drawing ever nearer to you, may always be close to each other in the communion of your saints. All this we ask for the sake of Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord. Amen.

The Peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you. Let us share the Peace of Christ with one another.
