Dear ones.

I wish you a restful summer, a time to pray and reflect and move forward, as I will be doing. This was neither the timing nor the manner I would have chosen to leave St Stephen's. But it became necessary. Now sifting through the books on the shelves, the papers on my desk and the collection of little projects, cards and mementos you've given me - I have many fond memories, as you will. Here are today's Top Ten; they might be different tomorrow. I share them in alphabetical order.

1. Adult Faith Field Trips and Pilgrimage

- who says the kids should get all the fun? Beginning on my first Labor Day weekend, we started visiting downtown congregations on that holiday Sunday. Then other trips included important places in local history, art and Lenten fish dinners. In 2015 we got up our courage and headed west to Arizona, for an unforgettable week learning about Navaho culture, community gardening, the grandeur of geology, and how to build a school "off the grid."

2. Creating liturgies, music and colorful accents to our worship, with the Altar Guild, **Choirs and music professionals** who have called this place home. Even when few folks turned up to comprise a congregation or concert audience, God was praised as hearts and voices were lifted. Can we admit that St Stephen's sanctuary needs a shot of color? I felt my efforts to provide some were appreciated; and the hangings I made for you will remain in the Altar Guild's care.

3. Knitting, stitching and packing bags with Crafting Kind-



ness. I'm so proud of these ladies, especially Barb Whitaker, their fearless leader. This group launched with the perfect Mission-Outreach formula:

- Find where your passion connects to a need of the community.
- Get like-minded (or like-talented) friends involved, within and outside the parish.
- Make a personal connection to those who benefit.

Crafting Kindness has done this and more, inspiring non-crafters to get involved too (purchasing supplies for hurricane victims, driving stuff to their destination, supporting girls wearing their handmade dresses, etc.) Way to go, team!

4. Family Nights and "Messy Church,"

which took "church school" to a new level of adult+kid involvement. I enjoyed returning to my roots in Family Ministry, sharing the love with volunteers who might not have tried this sort of thing before! Watching the kids' faces light up as they "got" the essence of a parable, held up their art project or belted out a song made my heart smile.

5. Our amazing "Nonagenarian Club." I've never been part of a community with so many active 90-plus-year-olds! Most are still attending church pretty often if not weekly. Five or six can be found at the Wednesday Bible Study, in addition to worship on the weekends. Others have had to

retire from participation here -- but I always enjoyed pastorally visiting, especially during the stressful weeks when I was doubting my abilities as a rector. You always cheered me up.

- 6. **The SOS Ministry Machine**. Leadership, organization, preparation, extreme hospitality and crisis management. An inspiring campaign to observe and then take a running jump into the action!
- 7. **Our talented Staff.** In its current configuration of Jacki Mudrich, Pam Bonkowski and Sue Gore, I've been blessed with extraordinarily helpful and patient pros in this year of too many transitions. I've not always been on-site to answer their questions or finish my projects, and they have rolled with my last-minute visits to a hospital or dashing to a meeting I forgot to tell them about.
- 8. **Wednesday Bible Study**, rarely cancelled except for terrible weather. "Eat, Pray, Love, Read a little" might best describe our sessions. We frequently did more story-telling than Scripture-reading, but that was the deeper point. We found that when friends gather in the Name of Jesus, the Holy Spirit raises memories and emotions to be shared safely. We sure laughed a lot, too! Kudos to Chris Herfurth who was an excellent "sub" whenever I had to miss class.
- 9. **White Water rafting** with the YAC group, after working with them to fix up several homes in Charleston WV. The kids were very brave! Me, not so much.
- 10. **Very best of all** is serving you Holy Communion at the Altar, or in the home of a sick person or shut-in. That has been my greatest privilege on a regular basis to share the nourishment of Jesus Christ with anyone, any age, who seeks His love.

Thank you all for reminding me that holy conversations and spiritual connections do withstand the tests of aging, illness, distance and even departure. The Body of Christ stretches but will not break apart, as long as we are faithful to Him who is the Head. Jesus knows and loves us best, and still has plans for us.



How many times have you said, "I wish they would fix these potholes! Well they heard you and Adams Road is going to be scratched down the roadbed and repaved from the I-75 ramp to South Blvd. from start to finish in early August. Adams Road will only be open to northbound traffic.

South Blvd will also be rebuilt from Crooks to Adams Road. This will begin in early June starting at Crooks Road and working west. During

this time South Blvd. will only be open to westbound traffic. Repairs in the vicinity of Crooks and Long Lake Rd are also indicated by recent signage.

Transition Leadership

Our Bishop has explained, "The Wardens and Vestry will be working closely with Jim Gettel, Canon for Congregational Life, and others in the Bishop's Office, to help facilitate this time of transition. With the Bishop's oversight, a process will be put in place to guide parish leadership toward a time when a new incumbent may be installed."

Until a member of the clergy is named with particular responsibilities, decisions usually made by the Rector will be handled by the Wardens. This includes finding clergy for pastoral emergencies or funerals, problems you might find in the building (report them please!), staff oversight, etc.
