

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR AND THE PRESIDENT & CEO JACK PAYNE AND SCOTT HAYES

Looking back at the myriad of accomplishments and challenges the Alberta Gymnastics Federation (AGF) experienced as an organization in 2018-2019, it is difficult to believe that merely a year has passed. As a community we have rolled up our sleeves; working harder and more collaboratively than ever to overcome some of the unprecedented pressures facing gymnastics and sport. Although uncomfortable at times, the resulting community engagement and changes will assist us in growing stronger and more resilient as an organization. The feedback we are receiving and the lessons we are learning are proving invaluable in the development of our next 4-year strategic plan which will take us into our 50^{th} anniversary year in 2021.

The most notable change for AGF, Gymnastics Canada (GymCan), and sport in general, has been the media and government focus on safe sport. AGF has always believed that gymnastics should be a positive experience for all and that every member is entitled to a safe and respectful sporting environment. The need to ensure proper strategies, polices and procedures, programming and resources are in place to make gymnastics truly welcoming and safe for all participants, has never been more critical to the future of our sport. Building on the work done to date, AGF created a new full-time Manager of Safe Sport position. The position is working closely with AGF staff, Board members, the new Safe Sport Task Force and community members to ensure sound Safe Sport policy, education and advocacy initiatives are developed and woven throughout our organizational fibers. Another new position that was filled this year, is that of the Manager of Membership Engagement and Gymnastics For All. Through one-on-one visits with member clubs across the province, this position has been serving to facilitate two-way dialogue. These consultations are developing a broader understanding of our organizational strengths and weaknesses while helping us identify opportunities for improvement and ways to navigate external challenges such as trampoline insurance limitations.

Meanwhile, in the gym and on the competition floor, we continued to experience outstanding achievements and participation in our competitive programs. Among the many highlights seen this year, we saw over 40 athletes compete and earn 12 podium finishes at the first ever Canadian Championships in Acrobatic Gymnastics this June. The Canada Winter Games were hosted in Red Deer and our very own Trampoline and Tumbling gymnast, Mark Armstrong acted as torchbearer at the opening ceremony while the Women's Artistic Team medalled for the first time since 1995. In Men's Artistic Gymnastics, we were excited to see Jackson Payne make the Canadian Team that would vie for an Olympic spot at World Championships. AGF was also proud to provide partial financial support to the 71 participants (ranging in age from 10 to 89 years young) on their journey to World Gymnaestrada in Austria; deemed the Olympics of the Gymnastics For All program because it showcases gymnastics on an international stage every four years and sees nearly 20,000 participants from over 60 countries.

The many strides and accomplishments we have made this year speak to the grit and gumption our athletes, coaches, judges, club administrators, parents and many volunteers demonstrate daily. A special note of thanks must also be expressed to the current Board of Directors, and departing Board members (Katie Biberdorf, Brady Spencer, Kim Shore, Maya Patrie, Marthe Desmarais-Moen, and Heather Davidson), for the countless volunteer hours they devoted to helping AGF navigate through a relatively tumultuous year. Thanks also to this year's departing staff members, Joanna Low and Cassie Crook, for the contributions they have made to the AGF team over the past four and two years respectively.

We are all passionate about our sport, and together we can make a difference. To be part of a community that is connected by a genuine and unwavering dedication to seeing our sport succeed is both humbling and a privilege and will continue to play a fundamental role in our future growth and success.







Safe Sport

- The AGF website was updated to include multiple options for complaint/misconduct reporting, best practice guidelines for members, and resources (helplines) to support individuals in distress. These resources can be accessed at abgym.ab.ca/Safe-Sport.
- A series of webinars were hosted to provide club members with current information about ongoing Safe Sport issues and best practices.
- A new full-time AGF Manager of Safe Sport position was created. This position has been assisting the President/CEO in managing disciplinary issues and is overseeing the development of AGF's Safe Sport policies as well as education and advocacy initiatives.
- AGF personnel (members of the Board of Directors and staff) are working through a major overhaul of the current code of conduct, disciplinary policy, appeals policy, and additional Safe Sport documents to meet the needs of AGF members.
- The AGF Safe Sport Task Force was established in Fall 2019. The Task Force was created to gain
 the perspectives of key stakeholders (athletes, coaches, and club administrators) as well as
 experts (mental health, physical health, human resources, legal, etc.) in developing AGF's
 approach to Safe Sport policy, education, and advocacy initiatives.







GYMNASTICS FOR ALL

Throughout the 2018 – 2019 season, there were many highlights in the Gymnastics For All (GFA) program.

The season kicked off with AGF's Congress, which ran from October 11 - 13, 2018 at the BMO Centre in Calgary. 7 workshops hosted 115 participants, covering a range of topics dedicated towards Gymnastics For All Programming, and feedback was shared that the weekend was a fantastic professional development opportunity.

In addition to Congress, the Awards Gala took place on October 12, 2018 where the GFA community celebrated various award recipients. This included 6 CanGym Gold Badges, 6 Exceptional Athletes, 9 Outstanding Coaches, 6 Program Volunteers, and 2 Performance Groups, making a total of 27 individual and 2 group award recipients.

Following Congress, the mentorship program provided the opportunity for 2 aspiring career coaches to work directly with our AGF sourced mentor coaches. Positive reviews were shared from both mentors and mentees in their experiences throughout the year, as hands on learning continues to prove to be highly effective.

Gymfest proved to be a highlight for all that were in attendance, as over 500 athletes and coaches participated in 27 performances and 7 workshops at Mount Royal University over the weekend of May 10 - 12. Participants explored different ways to celebrate this year's theme to "Colour Our World," and put on a fantastic show to our sold-out audience.

At the national scale, the revitalized CanGym program piloted the Active Start curriculum in January 2019, and GymCan continues to get closer to completing this project. GymCan is excited to share that the new CanGym program will focus more on participant development stages rather than skill acquisition, making the handbook more universal for all ability levels.

AGF was excited to announce that the CANJUMP Manual's revisions were recently completed, as AGF was aware that a formal trampoline curriculum was in high demand. Within the season, 25 copies were sent out to different member clubs to assist in facilitating developmental trampoline programming and were well-received by our members.

To all the staff, committee members, coaches, parents, and supporters, AGF would like to formally thank you for everything you do for the Gymnastics For All community. The positive learning environment we create would not be possible without all your efforts, and we applaud the time and energy you commit towards making this sport what it is.





ACROBATIC GYMNASTICS

2018 – 2019 was another successful year for acrobatic gymnastics in Alberta. The program continued to see rapid growth in membership, participation and local events. Most notable, was Alberta's strong representation at the first ever Canadian Championships in Acrobatic Gymnastics where 42 athletes from four clubs competed. We were also able to secure our strongest panel of judges to date in terms of training and experience for Provincial Championships.

Clubs

7 Alberta clubs offered competitive acrobatic gymnastics programs and saw a total of 180 registered athletes; an increase of nearly 50% compared to 2017–2018.

Training Opportunities

Alberta hosted an athlete training camp and coach's clinic with guest clinician Michael Rodrigues. Michael was a National Team member for 8 years and competed at 3 World Championships, 2 World games, and numerous World Cup and International Events; earning him a place in the USA Gymnastics Hall of Fame. The knowledge he was able to share with our 57 training camp participants proved invaluable.

Judge Development

With assistance from experienced judges Holly King, Alexander Gillis, Debbie D'Souza, and Nancy Carrs a course and additional training opportunities were organized to further train and prepare judges leading up to this year's Provincial Championships. Alberta also now has 4 certified National Level Judges in Acrobatic Gymnastics; Kelsey Garez, Suzan Bligh, Jennifer Kuhnert, and Erin Basisty.

TRAMPOLINE & TUMBLING GYMNASTICS

The 2018-2019 season was a busy one for Alberta. In addition to hosting Provincial Championships, 2 Cups and Western Canada Cup, Alberta saw athletes qualify for 9 international competitions. 9 athletes were also sent as part of Team Excel to Dallas Cup in Texas where they all qualified for finals and won 10 medals in total.

Clubs

14 Alberta clubs offered Trampoline & Tumbling Gymnastics and had a total of 288 competitive athletes.

Training Opportunities

4 training camps were hosted across the province for Tumbling, National Double Mini Trampoline, Canada Winter Games, Western Canada Cup and Canadian Championships.

The Alberta Trampoline & Tumbling Development Program (A.T.D.P) for pre-competitive atheltes also saw continued success. 3 events and 1 camp/coaching clinic were hosted as part of the program. 100+ athletes from over half of Alberta's clubs participated.

WOMEN'S ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS

The women's program saw continued success throughout the 2018–2019 competitive season. To support the growing Junior Olympic (JO) Program and to provide all JO 3-5 compulsory gymnasts with an opportunity to showcase their routines, AGF hosted the first ever Alberta Compulsory Championships in Medicine Hat. We also continued to see more coaches being certified at all levels, strong representation of Alberta Teams at Westerns and Canadians, and additional judges moving into the National and Brevet Systems.

Clubs


AGF continues to have 50 clubs registered in the Women's Competitive Program.

Training Camps

This year, AGF hosted four JO training camps with expert coaches from across Alberta presenting at all of them. 2 JO 1-5 camps were held in the fall (one in the north and one in the south), the 2-day overnight JO 6-8 camp proved to be a hit, and a final JO 1-3 camp was held in the spring. Being a Canada Winter Games (CWG) year, AGF also hosted a training camp for all eligible CWG athletes in September and a second training camp in January. Lastly, a 2-day training camp was hosted leading up to Canadian Championships to provide Team Alberta athletes with an opportunity to train together before the competition.

Judge Development

Alberta registered 94 judges this season from Brevet to Compulsory. All optional judges were required to complete a course this year due to changes in the JO Code of Points. To help new judges navigate the system and to increase judge retention, the Women's Judges Committee revamped the mentorship program. We also hosted an online live Facebook session for the first time and are looking to add more "live" sessions in the coming season.

MEN'S ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS

The 2018–2019 competitive season was a busy year for the men's program. Athletes, coaches, and judges mostly attended local events as the focus continued to be on domestic competitions and training camps; including Canada Winter Games, which was hosted in Red Deer, Alberta. We also saw continued growth in the number of registered athletes, which reached a total of 322 (277 in the Provincial Pathway and 45 in the Elite Pathway).

Clubs

AGF continues to have 16 clubs registered in the men's competitive program.

Judge Development

Alberta had 23 active judges, including 5 FIG judges. To make judge education more accessible, GymCan developed a beginner online course for Men's Artistic Gymnastics that can be taken by anyone at any time. Following this, AGF's judging chair, developed an 8 week National Level course for those judges with previous experience. The course was met with success and saw a total of 13 participants. GymCan is now working to develop a second online course for those who wish to advance further.

Provincial Pathway

The provincial program was packed with events. 6 invitational meets were held across the province, in addition to Provincial Championships in Edmonton. A Provincial and Elite level training camp was hosted at the University of Calgary, which drew 59 participants. Gymtastics Gym Club and the Calgary Gymnastics Centre also joined forces to host the Alberta Canada Winter Games selection event followed by a training camp at Exelta Gymnastics Club.

Elite Pathway

The Elite stream saw 45 athletes, most of whom took part in the various invitationals, training camps and Provincial trials offered, including; Spruce Moose Invitational in Spruce Grove, Salto Gymnastics Challenge in Edmonton, the University of Calgary International Cup in Calgary, as well as Canadian, Western and Provincial Championships.
