

From Fr. Tom

The Catholic Community Transition Team is active and is meeting regularly to compile and submit a Pastoral Plan to the Bishop by the end of the year. Participants were chosen because of their vested interests in the six churches and their open willingness and understanding of the spiritual needs of the communities served. I will keep you informed of the discussions and of the final draft that will be submitted to the Bishop. Some of the future planning items for Northern Franklin County involve the following:

- A plan is needed in the event one of our Priests is unable to
- Changes in frequency, location, and times of Masses, keeping in mind attendance and miles traveled, etc.
- What to do with unused buildings such as the Parish Center in Bombay. The Committee was unanimous in their recommendation to sell the Bombay building. This will be requested in the Pastoral Plan.
- The Committee will also recommend one celebration of Confir mation in 2019 including all candidates from the six churches.
- Parish income which should be sufficient to develop a cash reserve equal to 180 days of parish operating expenses.
- The possibility of having a seasonal schedule will be discussed.
- Starting April 7th, there will be one less Mass on Saturday. Time and place to be determined.
- There will be no daily Mass in Constable from December 1st
