Oscar Rak was a key member of Fairview College he was on the board of governors and also the main welding instructor for 24 years. Oscar was ticketed in 5 different trades B-Pressure welding, Parts Technician, Auto Body Mechanic, Heavy Duty Mechanic, Auto Mechanic he was also a Machinist in Hungary before immigrating to Canada. He put a strong emphasis on the importance of post-secondary education, and was a big supporter of trades programs and strongly encouraged getting a trade.
