Membership Renewal

As of December 31, 2019, memberships that were purchase prior to September 1st, 2019 have expired (grace period).

Roads and Parking Lots



Throughout the winter months, accessing Hullett Marsh can be difficult. Interior roads including Front Road, Burns Line, Conservation Road, Bridge Road and Sanctuary Line do not

have winter maintenance within the Hullett Marsh boundaries. FOH would like to remind users to use interior roads at your own risk. Please respect and follow any road closure that may occur within the Marsh - these are for your safety.

During the winter, two parking lots will have snow removed from them. These locations are: 40672 Hydro Line Road and 80602 Wildlife Line. Please be patient with FOH staff as we remove snow from these parking lots.

Snowmobiles at Hullett

Throughout the winter season, Ontario Federation of Snowmobile Clubs (OFSC) mark trails throughout Ontario, allowing snowmobilers to ride and enjoy the outdoors. Specifically, the Huron Trail Groomers Club are responsible for the trails that route through Hullett and surrounding areas.

FOH staff would like to remind everyone using these trails to please stay on OFSC marked trails. Snowmobiles leaving marked OFSC trails creates a safety concern and can disturb wintering wildlife. To prevent damage to

agricultural land, please stay off of trails deemed CLOSED.

December 31st, 2019 was the deadline for the **19th Annual Pheasant Challenge**. FOH would like to thank everyone who purchased tickets. A special thank you goes out to our sponsors **Clinton Sporting Goods** and **Ideal Supply** for generously donating both the shotgun and the generator as our prizes for the draw. Another special thank you goes out to everyone who sold tickets to ensure funds were generated to continue releasing in 2020.

Over the past season, 1000 pheasants – supplied by Sarah and Audrey Jackson of **Uplands Pheasantry** were released into Zone B between September and December. Of these birds, 100 were banded. During the season, **21 of 100 birds** were harvested and reported back to FOH. Congratulations to our successful hunters! Thank you to **Ideal Supply** for supplying FOH with orange hats as the band prize.





Pheasant Release Program 2020

As stated in an email sent out in December to the membership, the FOH Board of Directors have approved to continue the release of pheasants at Hullett for the 2020 season. The number of birds released will be determined by the financial support FOH receives towards the program.



With \$3000 from the 2019 FOH Fundraising Dinner, \$895 in cash donations and \$5590 from the Pheasant Challenge we have funding for a 920 bird release in 2020. We would like to thank you for your financial support that ensures the continuation and success of this program.

Vanessa Palmer Award

FOH is now accepting applications for the Vanessa Palmer Award. In 2005, this award was created in memory of Vanessa Palmer, a past Board of Director of Friends of Hullett. This award is given to a deserving youth, seeking post-secondary education on an annual basis.



Vanessa Palmer was born and raised in Southern Ontario. Throughout her life, she developed a love and passion for the outdoors. In 2002, Vanessa was elected to

sit on the Friends of Hullett Board of Directors. As a director, she was instrumental in developing a place for the public to learn about the natural environment.

To recognize Vanessa's outstanding commitment and achievement to environmental awareness education, the Vanessa Palmer award was created. This award is suited for students beginning their post-secondary education, preferably in biology, ecology, environmental studies or a related discipline.

To apply, students are asked to submit a letter explaining their environmental achievements and/or contributions. The successful applicant will be

presented with a \$200.00 cheque from FOH at our Annual General Meeting.

Youth Pheasant Hunt

On November 16, 2019, the 13th annual Huron Perth Youth Pheasant Hunt was held at Hullett Marsh. Similar to last year, we had 19 apprentice hunters participate.



After the usual prehunt safety talk and practice trap shoot, it was off to the hunt fields. Last year may not have been perfect weather but this year we had a lot more snow. The birds in the

morning seemed to behave a lot nicer than the afternoon birds for whatever reason.

Vanessa Rukas, our new MNRF Conservation Officer gave a short welcome and fur display at the break between hunts at lunch. We received a generous memorial donation from the Van Massenhoven family for their son, Kalvin. He was one of our young hunters 7 or 8 years ago.

I would like to thank all the volunteers again that make this hunt possible every year. From the dogs, dog

handlers, bird planters, marshals, mentors, cooks, speakers, instructors and the clean up crew. You make my job easy.

Eagle Buffer Zone

In 2013, FOH established a **400 metre buffer zone** around our resident Bald Eagle nest. This zone is to

help protect these birds from human disturbance during the early stages of the eaglet's life.

In Ontario, the Bald Eagle is a 'Special Concern' species under the Endangered Species Act. Our resident female is banded and well over 10 years old. As of the last nesting season, over 14 eaglets have fledged since the spring of 2013.



Please respect the Eagle Buffer Zone during the posted time period.

This buffer zone is in effect from February 1st to June 15th.





Winter Activities

With winter starting to establish at Hullett Marsh, there are many activities that users can participate in. Since 2 of our parking lots are maintained throughout the winter, some of our trails, including Blue, Yellow, White Green



and Purple trails, can all be accessed.

With trails open, users can:

- Snowshoe
- Cross-country ski
- Hike
- Geocache
- Hunt (following Hullett and Ontario Regulations)


In Memory of:
