The upcoming **AGM** will be held on **Sunday May 29** to vote for the 4 open positions on the FOH Board of Directors as



The Waterfowl Group/Ed Allen Report



The **Hullett Marsh Waterfowl Association (HMWA)** members continue to manage and supplement wetland work at the marsh.

Although the winter ice conditions were less than ideal, members and staff spent several productive days at the office and on the ice. And with the early thaw, they also added a few days in canoes. Both Mallard Tubes and Wood Duck Boxes were added, repaired, and readied for the 2016 nesting season. Most of the work was done in the A Zone; however, wood duck boxes were cleaned and readied in the B Zone. And, several mallard tubes were added to the Green Wing Pool. The volunteer pool was still quite small; but, with dedicated members like Gord McKay and others Ed has listed in the updates throughout the winter, a lot was accomplished.

Let's not forget either that several HMWA volunteers went "back to school" and became certified in Ice Safety for the sole purpose of volunteering on the ice at Hullett.

The HMWA will continue to work throughout the spring and summer, to monitor water levels and maintain and enhance the waterfowl hunting opportunities at Hullett. Renewed interest in A Zone projects is making the next few years very exciting at Hullett Marsh. 2016 goals include new signage for both hunting stake and parking lot numbers!

Sarah Hubbert will work closely with the HMWA and DUC managing water levels to provide optimum habitat for waterfowl during breeding and staging times.

The **Heritage Day Youth Hunt** will present a great opportunity (and demand) for HMWA volunteers – many more than have participated during the off season.

Summer Students at Hullett Marsh

FOH are very fortunate to receive provincial funding from MNRF in the Student Employment Program (SEP) for 2016. Two young students will be employed as "Maintenance Workers" for 7 weeks this summer. Job descriptions have been posted at 4 local high schools.



We also anticipate federal funding from the "Canada Summer Jobs" program to further boost our summer labour force.



Volunteer Opportunities

The Friends of Hullett are always seeking volunteers to help us manage the property. We encourage you to volunteer at a task that interests you. Our Trail Ranger program has been a huge success with hikers and we now have 5 active Rangers. The HMWA has interest in the A Zone Waterfowl Area.

You can volunteer as an individual or with a friend as there are always tasks that will improve the Hullett Marsh.

New Signs at the HPWA



Above is an image of the new sign project that FOH is currently working on. These signs will assist HPWA users to **define property boundaries** in conjunction with our User Guide Map.

The signage will also protect our adjacent property owners from trespassing issues. Please respect the private land.

Water Access at Hullett Marsh

Water access (for any purpose) is not permitted in the HPWA from **May 15 to August 1** each year to minimize the disturbance to nesting waterfowl. This regulation is in affect for both Zone A & B. This includes retriever training activities, wading, canoeing and kayaking.



Privy Replacement

The FOH Board has approved budget funds for 2016 to replace the **damaged and degraded privy** located at the **"Sugar Bush"** parking lot 80602 Wildlife Line. A concrete structure that is wheelchair accessible will be constructed in late spring this year.



Hullett Marsh Youth Waterfowl Clinic

FOH will be hosting a weekend waterfowl hunt and educational event for youth between the ages of 12 and 17 on the weekend of **September 16 to 18 2016 in celebration of "Waterfowl Heritage Day".**



This event has been partially funded by **Wildlife Habitat Canada** from revenue collected on the sale of migratory bird hunting permits to **encourage youth involvement** in the waterfowl hunting and the conservation of wetland habitats.




FOH has created a partnership of financially supporting organizations for this special weekend.




A big thanks to our corporate sponsor "Ideal Supply" for the continued assistance and donations to FOH.

A few suggestions as we begin a new year of our walks:

- 1) Lyme disease which is spread by ticks is becoming more prevalent, so have your dogs vaccinated and wear long pants and closed shoes and socks when walking
- 2) Don't forget your bug repellent, camera and binoculars
- 3) Dogs are welcome, preferably on a leash especially along the dikes as the Hullett does trap beaver and muskrats.
