Prayers of Thanksgiving and Worship

Grace and Peace to you members and friends of Calvary Lutheran, growing in God's Grace, in this summer of 2018. I have two items for prayers of thanksgiving and then have an opportunity to look at our worship gospel texts for July. I will conclude with one exciting announcement.

First, we give thanks, in anticipation, for the safe arrival home of our youth and adults (and those all across the country) who have been at our National Youth Gathering. Thanks be to God for what they have learned and experienced and how they will include that in their daily lives from now on.

Second, I have a question. What two organizations, when combined, have 290 years of ministry? Kind of difficult,

just a little out of the blue, but they are: Calvary Lutheran, Willmar and Lutheran Social Services of Minnesota. We give thanks to God that at our Southwestern Minnesota Synod Assembly, in June, Calvary was recognized by Lutheran Social Services (LSS) as the 2018 recipient of their "Servant of Christ Award." This award is given to one congregation in the Southwestern Minnesota Synod each year. (At the time of writing this article, we await scheduling a date when LSS will come to Willmar to give the award and plaque at worship here at Calvary.)

This year we have five Sundays in July. Four of those Sundays (weekends), have gospel readings from the 4th and 5th chapters of the Gospel of Mark. The last Saturday and Sunday in July, the text is from the beginning of the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John. Here are some of the varied themes: the woman healed who touches Jesus' cloak and the raising from the dead of Jairus' daughter; sent out 2 by 2; death of John the Baptist; Jesus has compassion for the crowd; Jesus—the bread of life and so many more. These are rich texts for us to reflect upon.

The exciting announcement I have is about Worship Service on Sunday, August 12. We, Calvary, will be worshiping together with Bethel and Vinje out at Robbin's Island at 9:30 AM. I hope you already have that marked on your calendar and the wonderful worship leaders and musicians "Dakota Road" will be there to lead the music at worship.

So, it is right to give God thanks and praise, blessings to you as you read, study and reflect upon the scriptures and we always look forward to seeing you at worship—and remember, August 12 at Robbin's Island. Take the gifts that God has given to you and go and share them with the world, go in Christ's peace.

This has been the case in past calls at Calvary Lutheran Church and has been the case for calls in congregations across the world. Our hope, in June, is to perform a second round interview(s). Sleep in comfy, but rustic cabins (toilets and showers are in a bath house on site, not in cabins), or bring your camper/tent.

Cost for all 4 Days: (*If you come for part of the time your cost can be prorated based on your schedule*) \$205 per cabin, sleeps 4-12; \$50 per family for camper/ tent. The cost of meals for four days is \$75 per adult and \$38 per child.
