- **6:35pm-7:30pm Confirmation -** Grades 7-10






THIS CHANGES EVERYTHING!!

Calvary's Family Promise

We are so happy to shout about how Calvary's unselfish dedication improves the lives of families in our community.

We do however know that some members and friends of Calvary are not yet aware of what the Family Promise ministry is.

The Family Promise core program is a way for communities to address the challenge of family homelessness by using existing resources. Not only does this make the program cost efficient, it makes it effective. Family Promise is not just about getting families into housing, but addressing all the underlying issues and using the community to keep them in housing.

HOW IT WORKS

The resources are already there. In the community there are congregations that can provide space in their buildings to serve as temporary (evening) homes. Day centers, (7:30 am-5pm) where families can take showers, receive case management and look for housing and jobs, can be located at a house of worship or agency. There is transportation to get families from the host congregations to the day center and back. With volunteers giving their time, making meals, and sharing hospitality, family homelessness is addressed without the creation of expensive shelters.

Calvary will host families in early September. Our Calvary will be alive with volunteers and our homeless quests.

We are getting ready for our 2018 Stuff the Bus Campaign! Thank you for your past support of United Way's Stuff the Bus campaign. In 2017, our combined efforts provided over 12,000 school supplies to our community's neediest families. The donated items were shared with families in the following school districts, ACGC, Benson, BOLD, CCS, KMS, CMCS, Litchfield, MACCRAY, NLS, RCW, St. Mary's Bird Island, Dream Academy and Willmar. Your commitment to this campaign has helped a significant number of children be prepared for their first day of school! Our 2018 Stuff the Bus campaign began on Monday, July 30 and ends on Friday, August 17. We will be dropping bins off beginning July 24 and picking them up the week of August 13-17. If you are a Willmar location, we will pick the bins up on Friday, August 17. If your location is an outlying community, we will pick up earlier that week.
