British Columbia native Jason Ruff was acquired by the Tampa Bay Lightning midway through the 1992-93 season in a trade with the St' Louis Blues. After playing one game with the Lightning, he was assigned to the Atlanta Knights, scoring 11 goals with 14 assists in 26 games. In 1993-94, Ruff played in six games with the Lightning but spent the better part of the season in Atlanta, playing in 71 games with 24 goals and 25 assists. Ruff's team high 17 assists during the 1994 playoffs helped the team win the Turner Cup. This black mesh road gamer by M Sport has the Knights embroidered sewn on logo of the front, sewn three color twill numbers on the back and sleeves, and a matching nameplate with sewn three color twill letters. M Sport and IHL logos are embroidered directly to the jersey at the right rear hem line. According to Kurt Harvey, the team's equipment manager, these jerseys were worn for two seasons and were subjected to numerous repairs, including the massive 10" tear that extends from the neckline down across the tip of the front crest. The jersey exhibits great game wear on the sleeves and numerous stick marks on the front. I purchased this jersey from another collector.
