

Atlanta Knights Brent Gretzky 1993-94 game worn jersey, size 52.

Brent Gretzky was drafted by the Tampa Bay Lightning in the 1992 NHL Entry Draft, but did not find the same success as his brother Wayne. During Brent's 13-game tenure with Tampa Bay, he played once against Wayne. Together, Wayne and Brent hold the NHL record for most combined points by two brothers (2857 for Wayne and 4 for Brent). Brent played three seasons in Atlanta and was a fan favorite. His best scoring season was '92-93 campaign, which is also the season he played in the most regular season games. Gretzky wore #16 that season, but switched to #9 after Keith Osborne departed. This black Bauer road jersey has great game wear. The Knights switched to these Bauer jerseys at some point during the second half of the season. It has the Knights embroidered logo sewn on the front, sewn two color twill numbers on the back and sleeves. Bauer and IHL logos are embroidered directly to the jersey the right rear hem line. Both sleeves have damage and there are numerous stick marks. I purchased this jersey from another collector and restored the missing nameplate with matching fabric and sewn two color twill letters according to team specifications. It has been photo matched to a picture of Brent on a hockey card.



A forensic alternate light source was used to visualize the adhesive residue to confirm that the jersey nameplate was Gretzky's. You can clearly see the G and R when viewed using the special filter. A stick or puck mark on the crest was photo matched to a picture of Brent on a hockey card.
