

Atlanta Knights Jock Callander 1992-93 game worn jersey, size XL.

Saskatchewan native Jock Callander was never drafted by an NHL team, signing with St. Louis as a free agent, playing in the CHL and IHL for the first five years of his pro career. After signing with Pittsburgh, he split his time between the Penguins and the IHL. In 1991-92, he came up to the Penguins for the playoffs, appearing in a dozen games en route to the Stanley Cup. Over the summer, though, he became a free agent and was picked up by the expansion Tampa Bay Lightning. Callander played only eight games with the Lightning but played in 69 games for their IHL affiliate Atlanta Knights, scoring 34 goals with 50 assists for second place in team scoring. Remarkably, Callander did not return to the Knights, but went on to finish an impressive career in the IHL with the Cleveland Lumberjacks. All totaled, Callander holds the record for regular season games played in the IHL, and is second in all-time scoring with 1242 points over seventeen seasons. This black mesh road gamer by M Sport has the Knights embroidered sewn on logo of the front, sewn three color twill numbers on the back and sleeves, and a matching nameplate with sewn three color twill letters. M Sport and IHL logos are embroidered directly to the jersey at the right rear hem line and it has an Opti Sportswear neck tag.
