

**Macon Whoopee Denis Lamoureux 1997-98 game worn jersey, size XXL.**

St. Catharines, Ontario native Denis Lamoureux turned pro in 1996 and played in the ECHL in his first professional season. After being released by the ECHL Johnstown Chiefs after five games in 1997, he was acquired by Macon. He scored 20 goals with 22 assists for 42 points in 36 games with the Whoopee before being dealt to Memphis. This jersey is very similar to those worn in '96-97, with the major differences being the Make A Wish Foundation embroidered patch sewn on the upper right chest, the team name is embroidered on the fig leaf logo and the tagging. This navy mesh jersey with green and white trim features two color sewn twill drop-shadow style numbers like those used by the NY Rangers. The two color twill fig leaf logo is sewn on the front and the team name is embroidered on. The front logo bears Lamoureux's autograph. There is a pair of white twill fig leaves sewn onto the shoulders. A matching fabric nameplate with single color twill letters is sewn on the upper back. A Jersey Express neck tag covers the size tag and a screened on Jersey Express logo is located on the lower back hem. The seam at the bottom of each sleeve has been cut, presumably to provide a looser fit. I acquired this from another collector who stated he purchased it from a former Whoopee season ticket holder.
