

Atlanta Thrashers Patrik Stefan 1999-2000 Inaugural Season authentic jersey, size 56.

The newly formed Thrashers selected Patrik Stefan with their first overall selection in the 1999 NHL Entry Draft. While Stefan played the most games for the Thrashers from those selected in that initial draft, he was widely regarded by many as one of the biggest disappointments in the history of the NHL draft. At the end of the 2005-06 season, Stefan was traded to the Dallas Stars, playing in only 41 games for the Stars in 06-07 and scoring a mere 11 points, his last season in the NHL. This blue CCM road jersey has the embroidered Thrashers alternate logo sewn on the front, two primary logo patches sewn onto each shoulder and the sewn player nameplate with two color twill letters on the back. Player numbers in two color sewn twill adorn the feathered trim sleeves and back. NHL shield and CCM logos are embroidered directly to the rear hem. An embroidered NHL 2000 millennium patch worn by all teams during this season is sewn on the upper right front. The yellow arrow stripe trim around the neck and at the bottom hem finishes this inaugural season road jersey, believed by many to be the best looking of all the jerseys worn by the Thrashers during their eleven seasons in Atlanta.
