

Gwinnett Gladiators Jordan Fox 2008-09 game worn jersey, size 56.

Suburban St. Louis native Jordan Fox played 68 games for the Gladiators during the 2008-09 season, his one and only season with Gwinnett. Fox led the team in scoring with 29 goals and 38 assists for 67 points. During the team's Pink in the Rink weekend in February, Fox's specialty jersey brought in \$3000, the most of any of the player jerseys auctioned off. Fox spent the next season with the ECHL Wheeling Nailers then played in Europe for two years. He retired from hockey at the conclusion of the 2012-13 season, playing for his hometown St. Charles Chill in their one and only season in the Central Hockey League. During the 2007-08 season, the Gladiators fifth in the ECHL, the team designed a gold fifth anniversary jersey with a special anniversary logo. This gold SP jersey has the same design, with the team alternate logo replacing the fifth anniversary logo. Smaller Gladiator primary logo patches are sewn on each shoulder, along with the usual embroidered Kroger sponsor patch on the upper right chest. An embroidered SP logo is on the upper left chest. Two color twill numbers are on the back and sleeves and the matching fabric nameplate has sewn single color letters. On the back hem the SP logo is embroidered to the jersey next to the sewn on ECHL embroidered logo, with the embroidered Meigray patch sewn on the opposite side. I acquired it from an eBay auction.
