

Gwinnett Gladiators Myles Stoesz 2008-09 game worn jersey, size 56.

6'2", 208-pound Myles Stoesz was drafted by the Atlanta Thrashers in the last round of the 2005 NHL entry draft, 207th overall. The Manitoba native was a defenseman when drafted, but was converted to left winger. In his first pro season with the Thrashers ECHL affiliate Gwinnett Gladiators, Stoesz set a new Gwinnett record for most penalty minutes in a game with 41 against Reading on October 28 and by the end of the season led the ECHL with 291 penalty minutes. After scoring just four goals in each of his first two seasons with Gwinnett, Stoesz was part of a trade made by the Thrashers with the New Jersey Devils on March 2, 2009 along with Niclas Havelid in exchange for Anssi Salmela. This black SP jersey from the first half of the season has an embroidery over twill Gladiator primary logo sewn on the front, along with the usual embroidered Kroger sponsor patch. An embroidered Gwinnett wordmark logo patch is sewn just below the neckline. Two alternate logo patches are sewn on the shoulders, as are the two color twill numbers and the black nameplate with single color letters. On the back hem the SP logo is embroidered to the jersey next to the sewn on ECHL embroidered logo, with the embroidered Meigray patch sewn on the opposite side. I acquired it from an eBay auction.
