

Atlanta Thrashers Rich Peverley 2010-11 game worn Bauer Vapor gloves, 14”.

Rich Peverley was claimed off waivers by the Thrashers in January, 2009. He played in 39 games, scoring 13 goals with 22 assists, earning a two year contract extension. In 2009-10, Peverley played in all 82 games, scoring 22 goals and racking up 55 points. In February, 2011 he was traded to the Bruins, mercifully before the sale of the Thrashers, where he achieved the ultimate for an NHL player, having his name engraved on the Stanley Cup. Peverley was photographed multiple times during the 2010-11 season wearing similar Bauer Vapor X:60 Pro gloves. It is not unusual, however, for today’s NHL players to go through numerous pairs of gloves during a season so this pair could be one of many similar models used during the same season. Both palms exhibit some wear, with the left palm being worn through in one area. They are in the Thrasher colors of navy and gold, with Peverley’s name embroidered in white on the side panels of each glove. The exterior of the Bauer X:60 glove is made from both synthetic leather and nylon; synthetic leather for durability and nylon for its flexibility and breathability. Dual density foam is used; the less dense foam is on top of the hand for cushion and comfort while the denser foam faces the exterior for protection. The back of the glove has a 4-roll design, formed for the proper way a player grips a hockey stick. The cuff is flared outward to promote mobility and the palm is constructed with nash leather, commonly used on palms for its comfort and longevity. Bauer’s red ThermoMax Plus liner contains moisture wicking and anti-microbial properties to prevent bacterial build up.
