

Atlanta Gladiators Jamie Fritsch 2009-10 game worn helmet, size M.

Maryland native Jamie Fritsch played 146 games of collegiate hockey with the University of New Hampshire. Following his last game in his senior year, the NHL Philadelphia Flyers signed Fritsch to an amateur try-out contract, due to issues with salary cap limitations. He made his NHL debut in the Flyers' last regular season game against the New York Rangers, filling in for injured defenseman Ryan Parent, going +1 in the Flyers' 5-4 home loss. The following season, Fritsch signed with the Gwinnett Gladiators and played in 48 games posting 5 points. In February, he appeared in two games for the AHL Norfolk Admirals. Following the season, he was traded to the Las Vegas Wranglers. This Reebok 8K black helmet was worn with both home and away jerseys during the 2009-10 season. It has a team applied number on the back, an Oakley VR904 visor along with the original chin strap. The helmet was obtained from another collector who acquired it directly from the team at an equipment sale.
