Chicago native Scott Morrow was selected in the fifth round of the 1988 NHL Entry Draft by the Hartford Whalers in 1988. Morrow played four years with the University of New Hampshire. In his senior year, he scored 30 goals and 53 points in 35 games. After turning pro, Morrow spent two years in the AHL before being picked up by Calgary in a trade with Hartford in January 1994. He was called up to the NHL for the only four games of his career during the same season. Morrow was released by the Flames soon thereafter and was signed as a free agent by the Philadelphia Flyers, spending several years in IHL and the AHL. He continued to play professionally until he joined the Augusta Lynx for two seasons beginning in 2000 where he served as the team's captain prior to his retirement from professional hockey. This white CCM jersey sports the embroidered five color team crest on the front and a pair of embroidered Lynx paw and puck patches on each shoulder. The numbers consist of three color sewn twill, and the matching cloth nameplate has three color sewn twill letters. Embroidered CCM logos are located on the lower left front hem and on the back below the neckline. The embroidered CINTAS sponsor patch is sewn on the upper right chest. Morrow's autograph in black Sharpie is just to the left of the three color captain's C. The jersey shows extensive game use and what appears to be blood and sports drink stains on the front.
