

Gwinnett Gladiators Jeff Campbell 2005-06 game worn jersey, size 54.

Hensall, Ontario native Jeff Campbell played four seasons of college hockey at Western Michigan University before his first full season of professional hockey with the Gladiators. Campbell and teammate Mike Vigilante led the team with 30 goals each in 2004-05. In his second season, Campbell led the team with 30 goals and 53 assists for 83 points, earning him the ECHL Most Valuable Player Award as voted by the league coaches. He is also the only Gladiator in team history to score 30 goals in back to back seasons. Campbell also made his first career trip to the AHL that season with the Lowell Lock Monsters. The Gladiators also made it to the ECHL Finals that season, losing to the Alaska Aces in five games. This white SP jersey from the second half of the season has the large embroidered on twill Gladiator logo sewn on the front, with the smaller Gladiators wordmark logo sewn above it. Two alternate logo patches are found sewn on each shoulder. The embroidered Kroger sponsor patch is sewn on its usual upper right chest location. The two color twill numbers are sewn on, as is the player nameplate and fight strap. Campbell signed in silver Sharpie on the number 5 on the back, adding the notation of 05-06 ECHL MVP. On the back hem the SP logo is embroidered to the jersey, but the Meigray and ECHL logos are embroidered patches. It was purchased from another collector, who obtained it directly from the team at the conclusion of the season.
