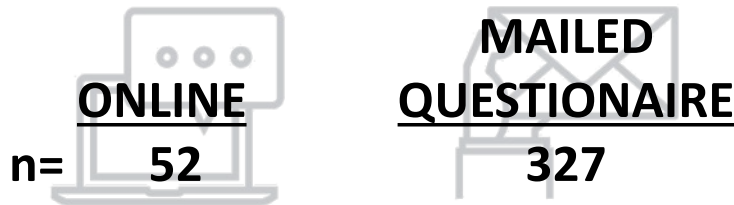

Research Methods

- Research findings based on a community survey with n=379 households in Lake Bluff SD 65 boundaries. SD 65 questions were part of a larger survey which included questions for the Village and Lake Bluff Park District (research co-sponsors).
- Data collection: October 14 and November 16, 2017. Response rate was 12.3%.
- Residents were given several response options (mail questionnaire, online survey, and phone interview).



- Sample of survey respondents was weighted to match 2016 US Census data for Lake Bluff and Knollwood (by region, gender, age, ethnicity, and percentage of households with children).
- Assuming no sample bias, the margin of error is +/- 5.0% (at the 95% confidence level).

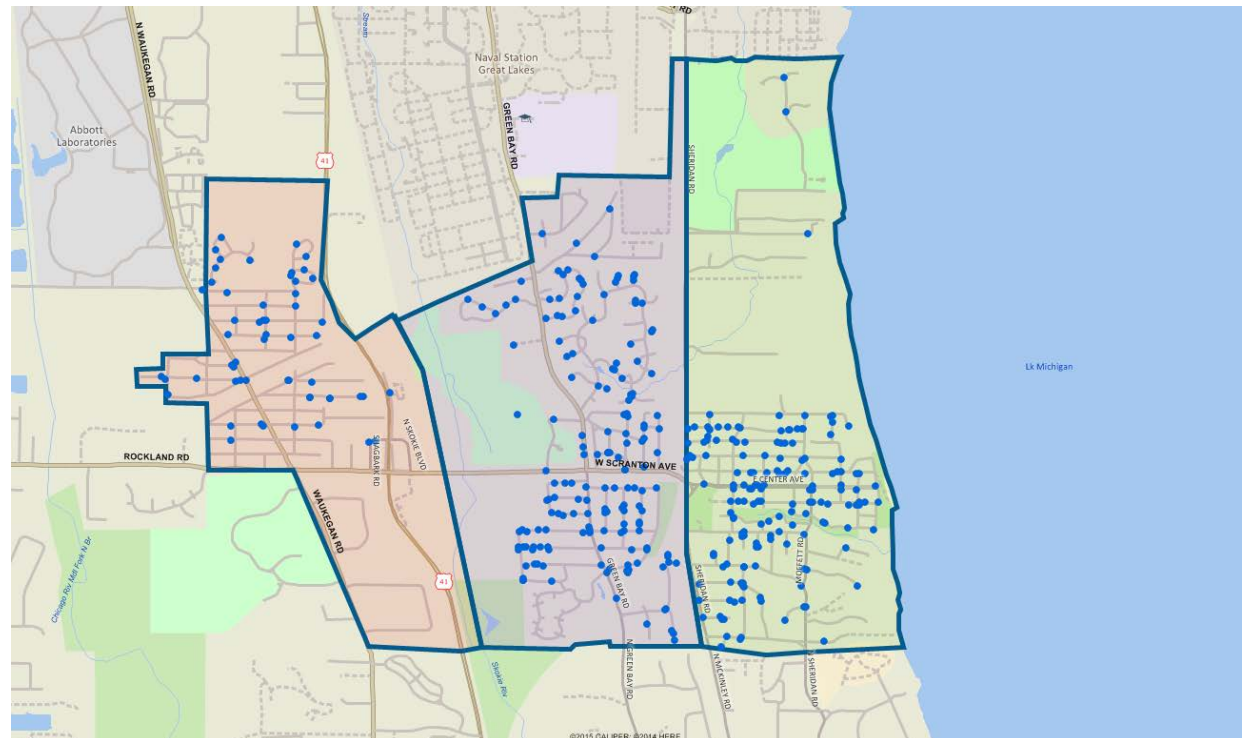

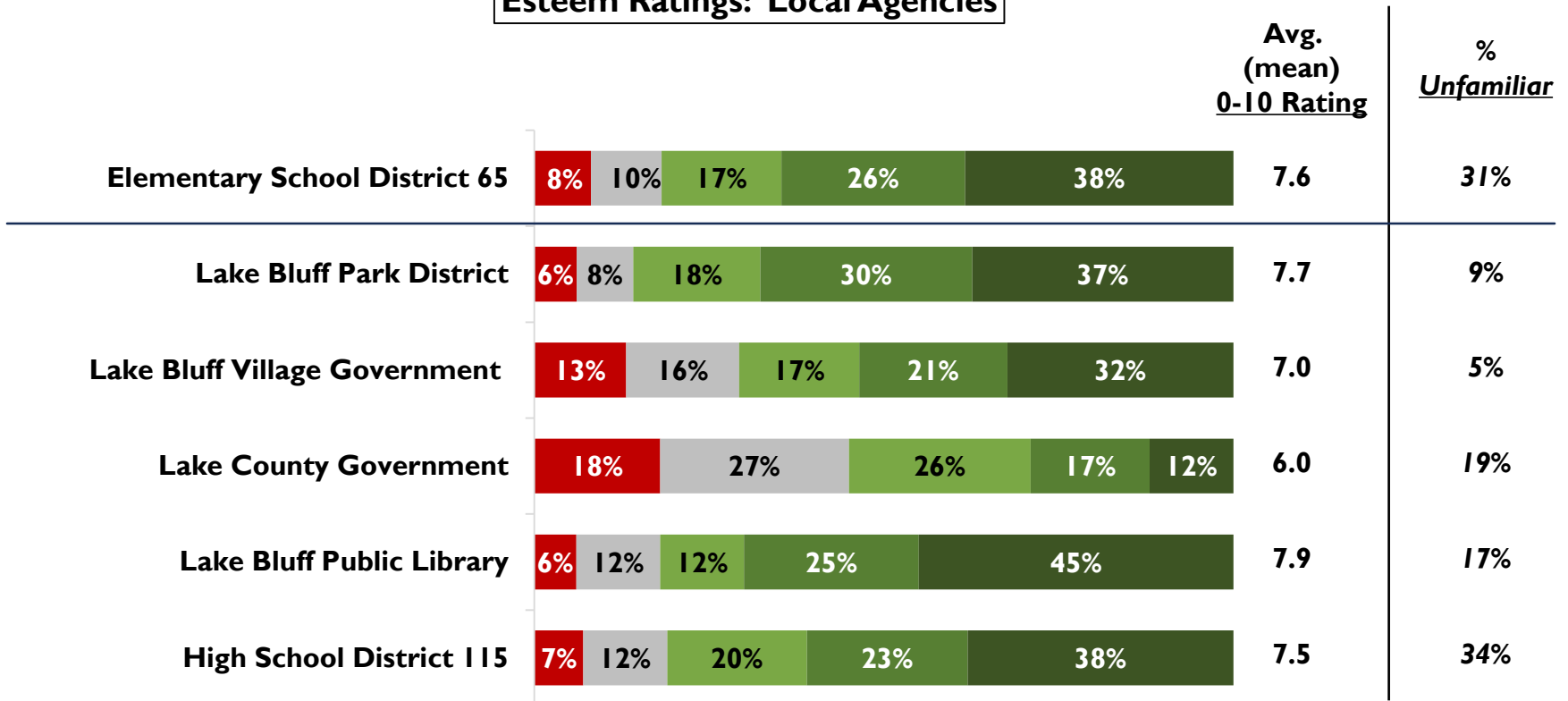

Residents give District 65 very strong esteem ratings overall.

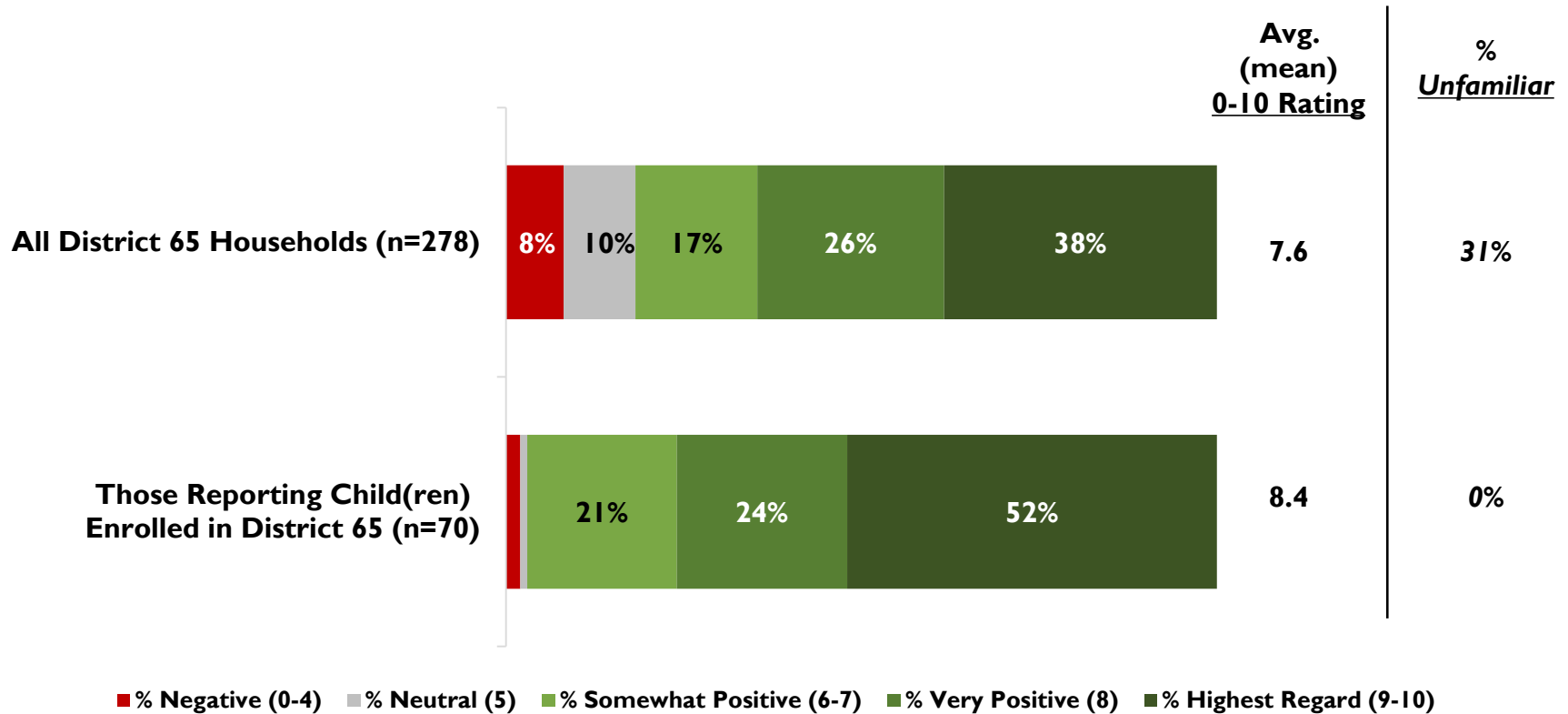
Esteem Ratings: Local Agencies

School District 65 Esteem Ratings



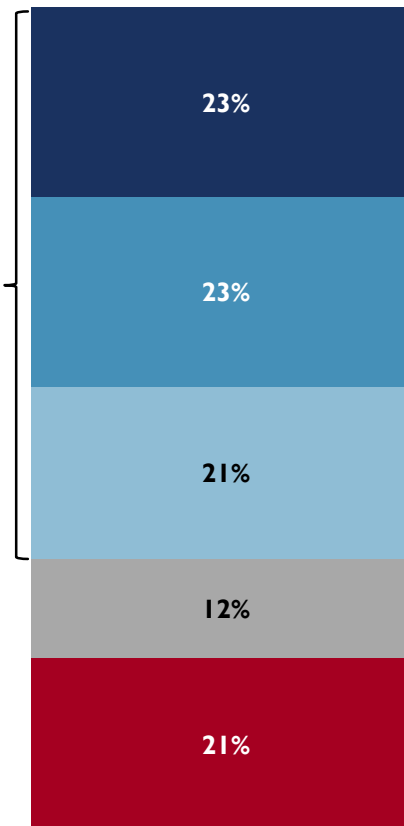
When informed that 40% of their property taxes go to District 65 Schools, residents feel it represents a fairly good overall value.

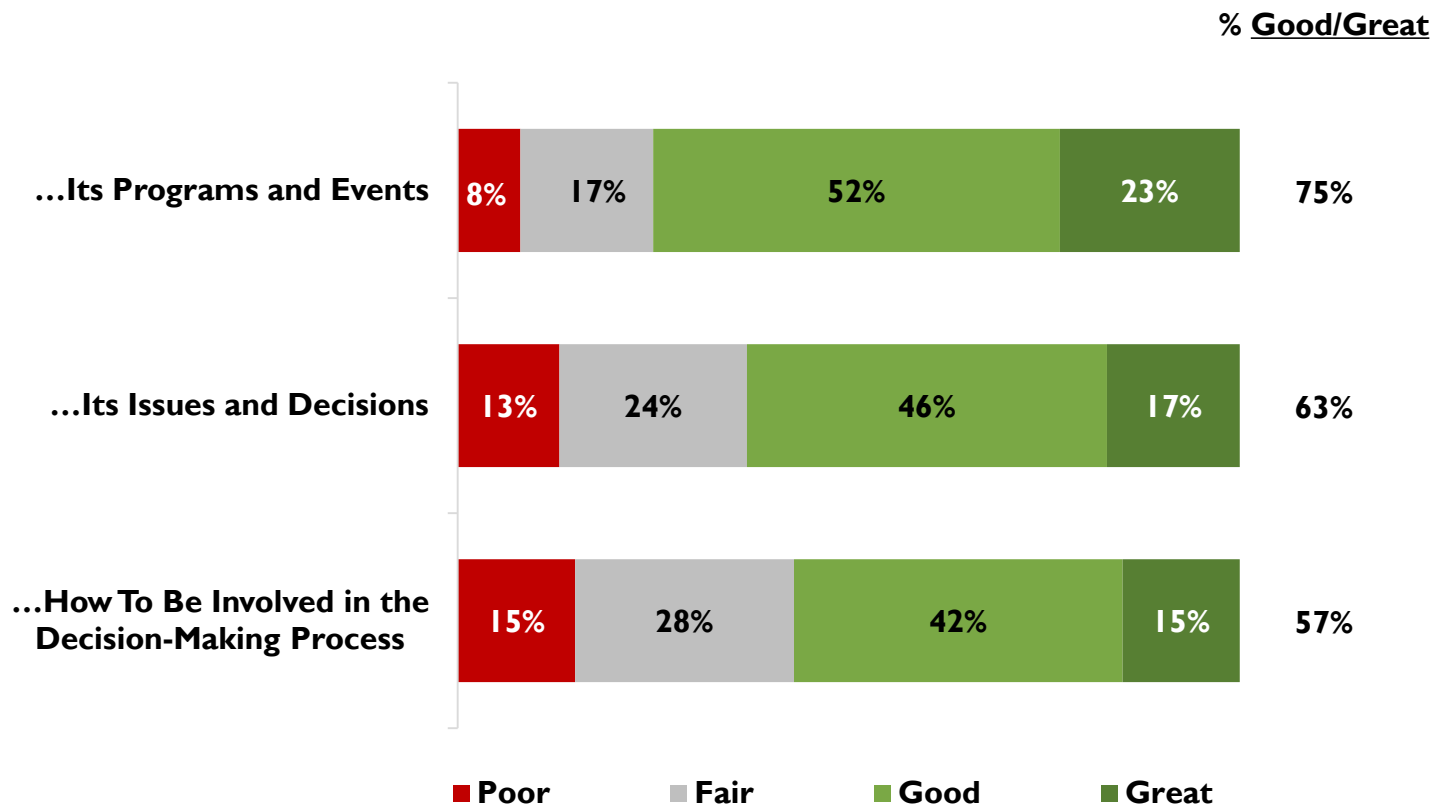

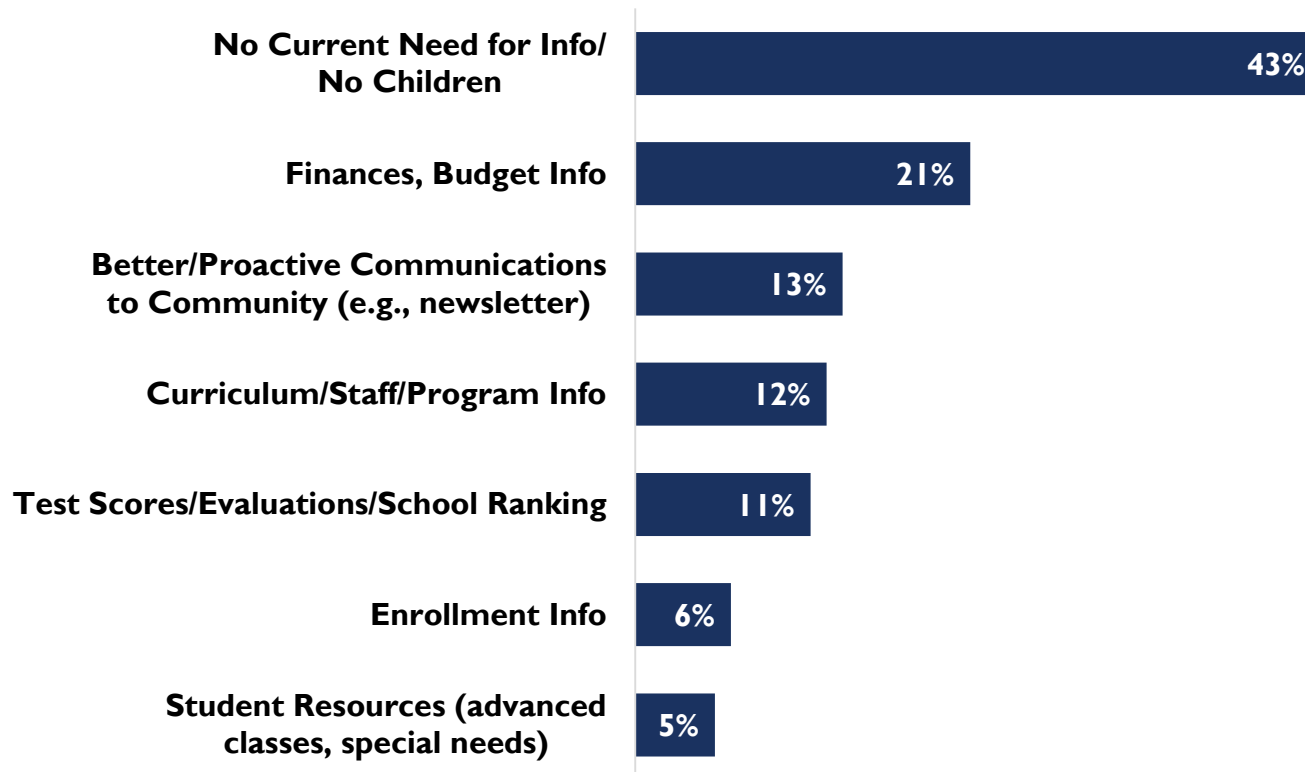
School District 65 receives positive grades on its effectiveness in informing residents of its events and decisions on key issues.

Those with information requests for District 65 most often seek to understand its finances and budget.

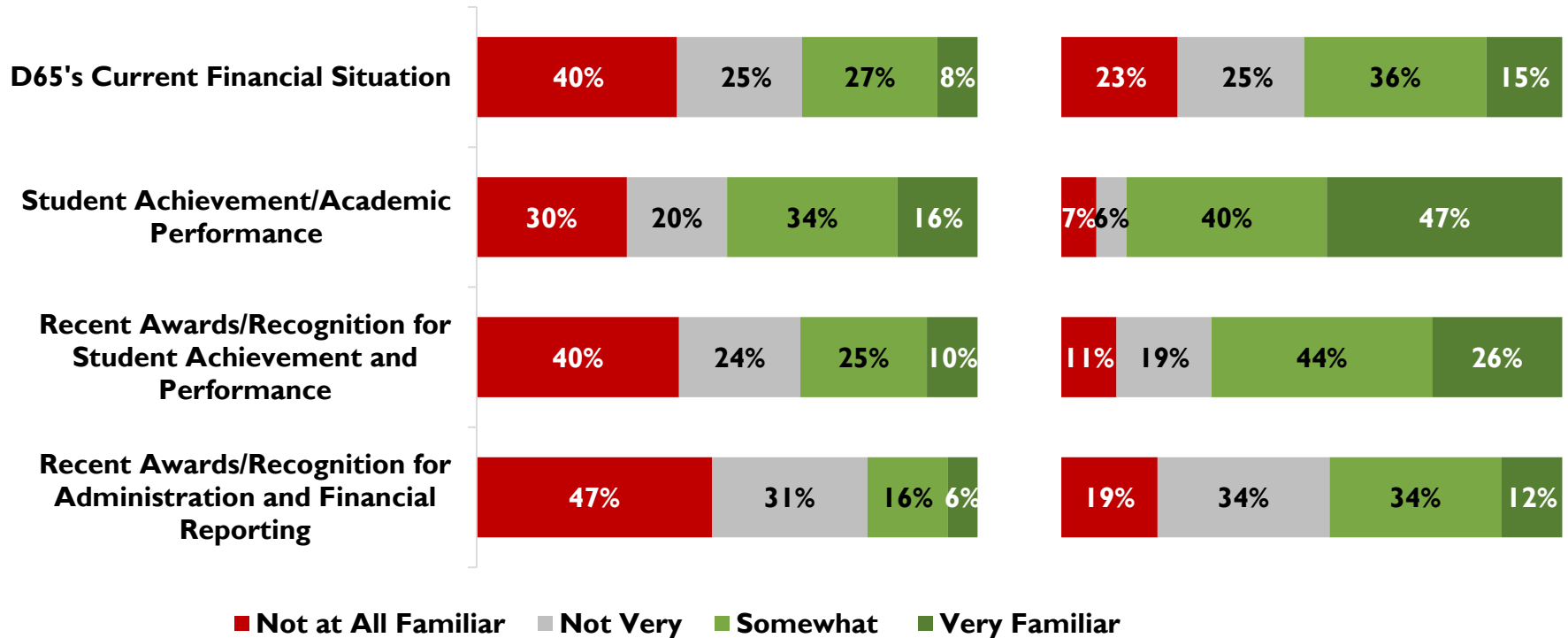
**Top Information Needs from School District 65

Most District residents are unaware of key D65 topics, especially those pertaining to finances and recent student and admin recognition.

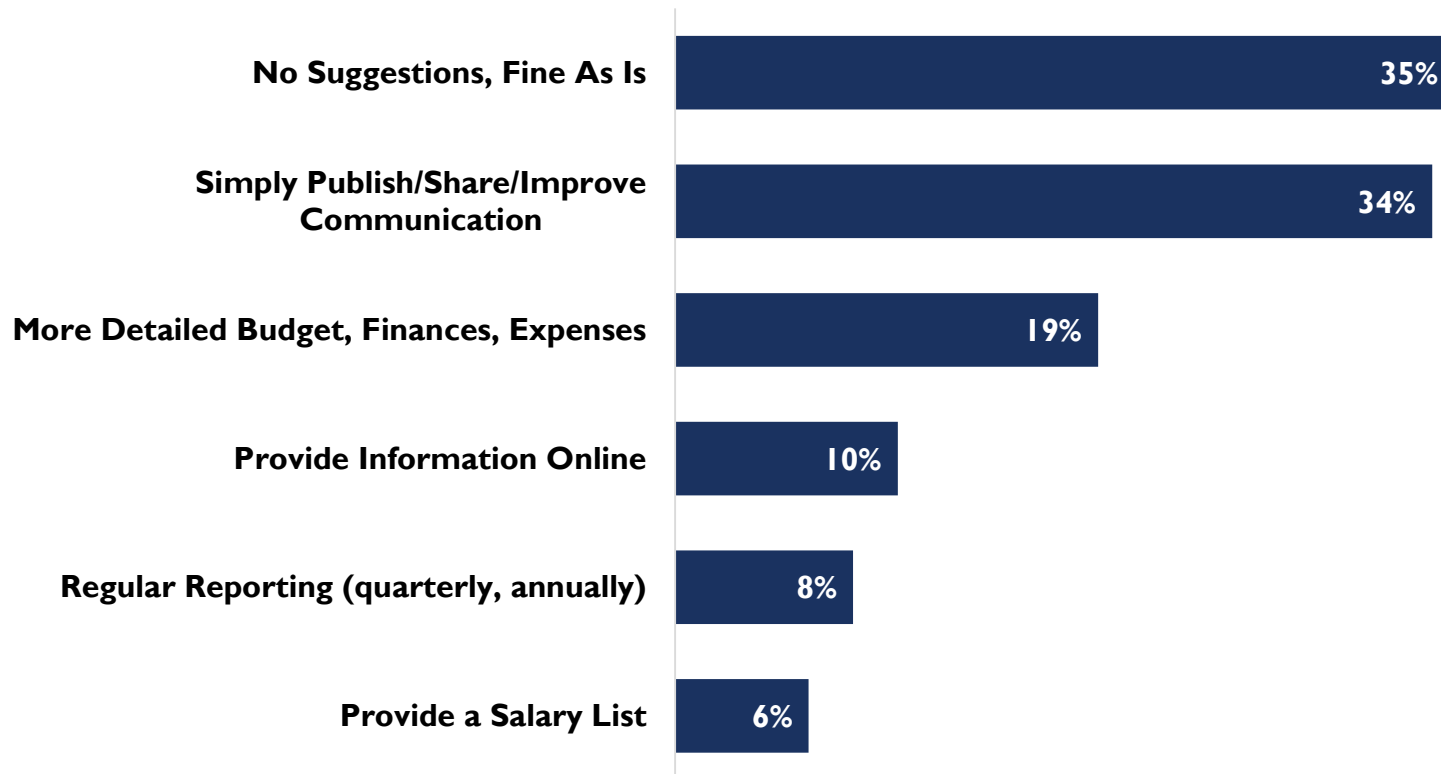
**Awareness of Key Topics:

D65 Parents Only**



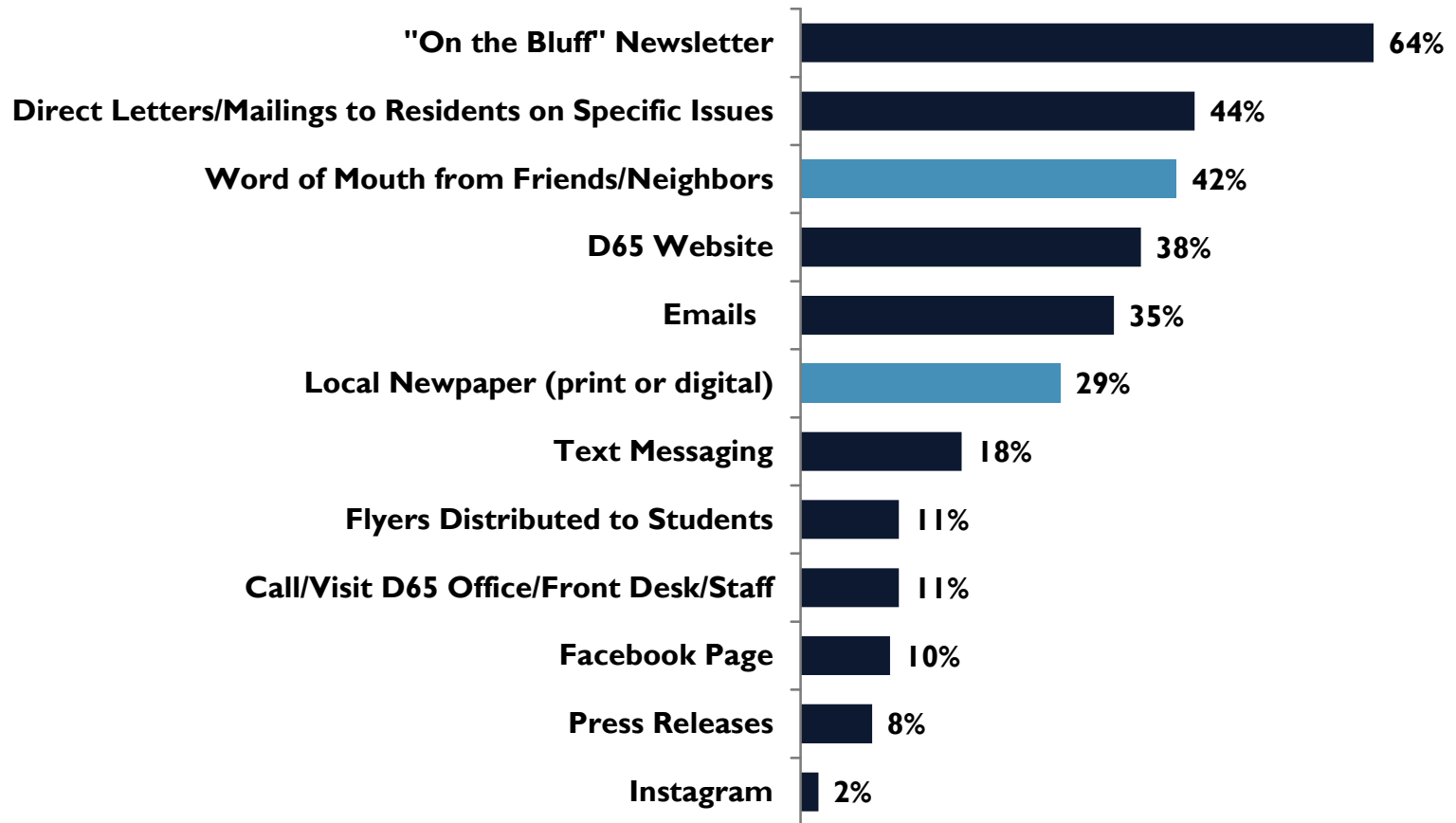
Regarding improved communications and transparency of District 65 finances, residents offer a wide range of suggestions.

(n=126 providing answers, top multiple open-ended responses)



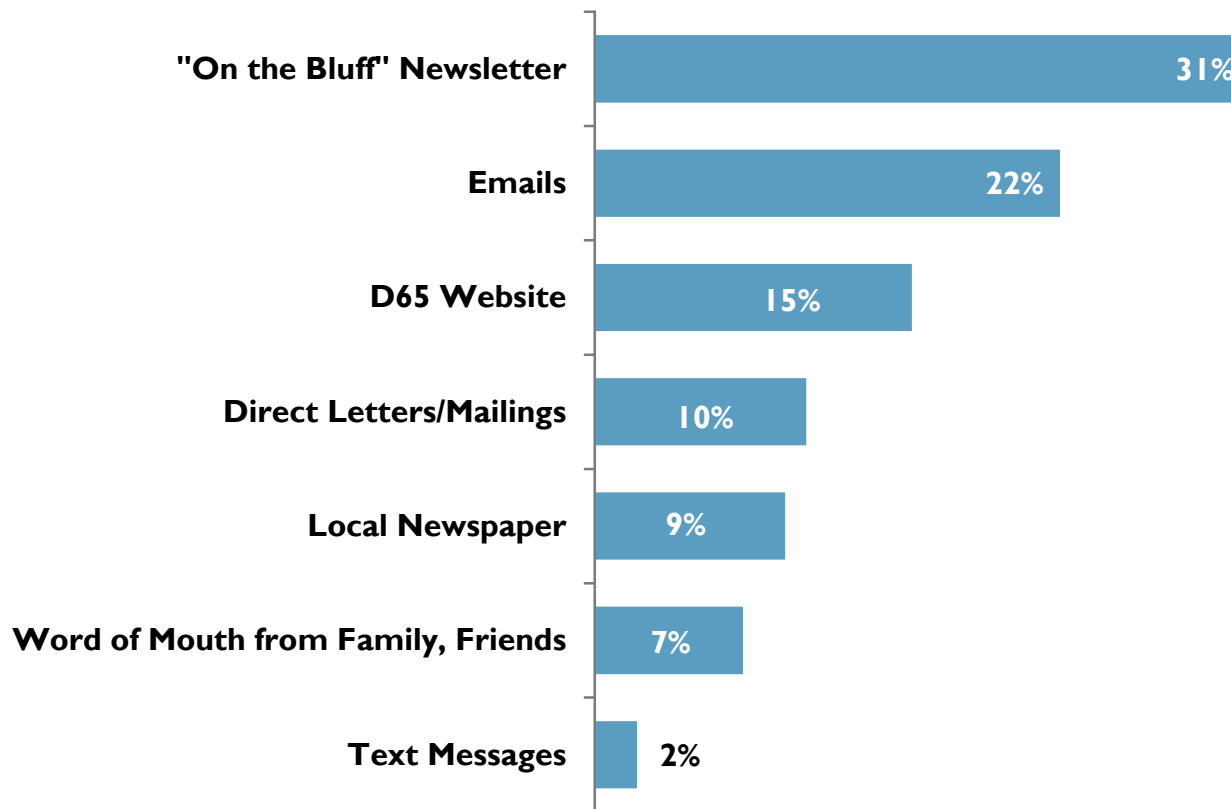
Nearly half of local residents look to “On The Bluff” for D65 information.

In terms of preferred information sources about District 65, residents rely on three main channels.

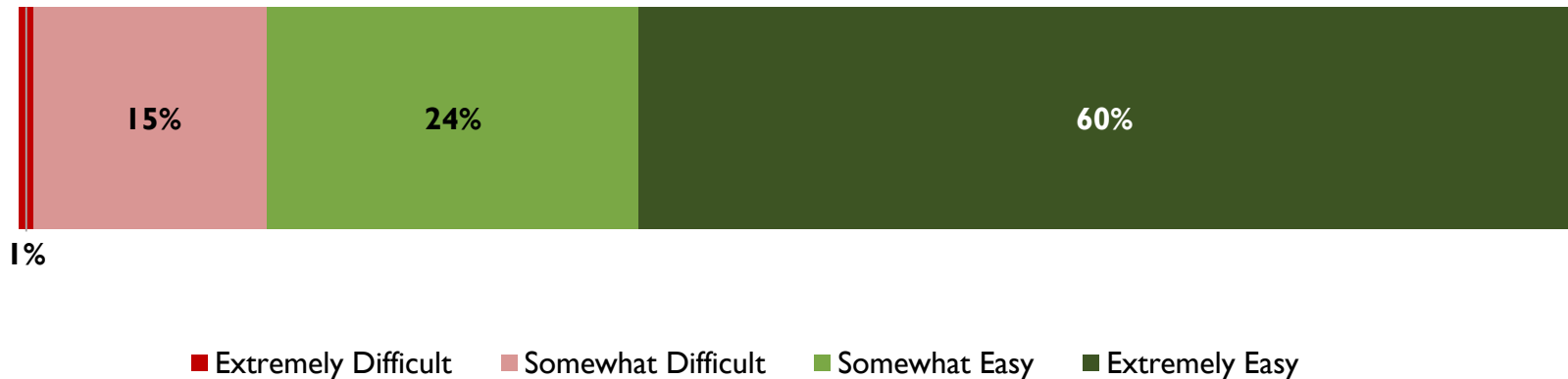
Preferred Sources for D65 Information



Q33. What is your preferred source of information about Elementary School District 65?

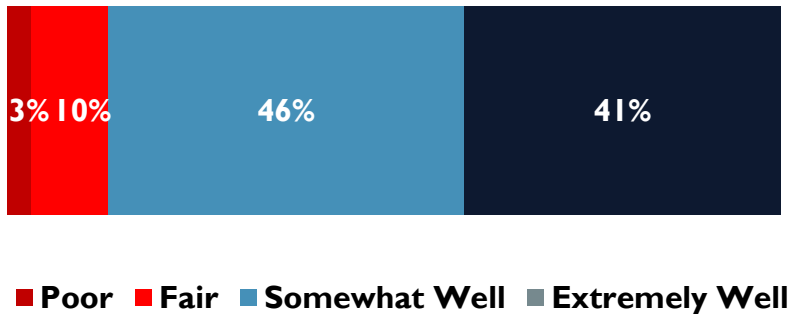
Among those familiar with the District website (mostly D65 parents), most find it to be very user-friendly.

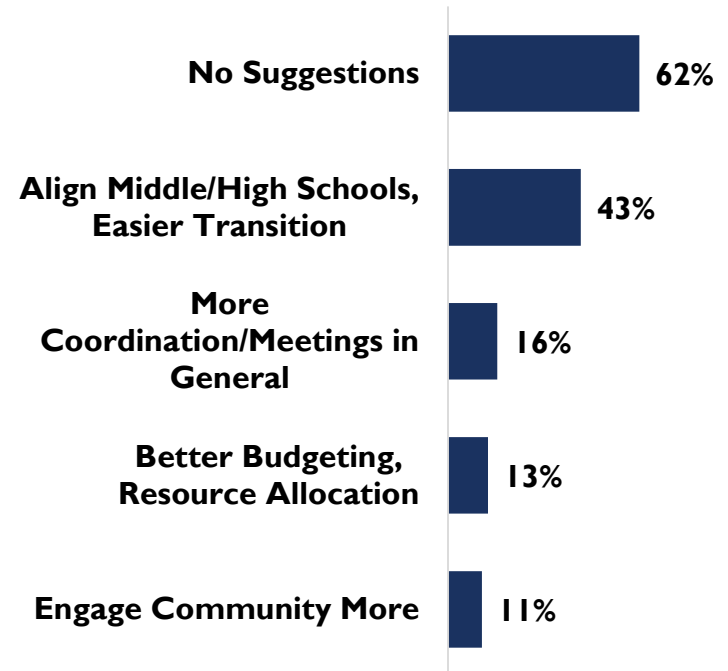


Most residents (63%) are not familiar with the degree to which D65 cooperates/coordinates with other local agencies.

Suggestions for Greater D65 Cooperation (n=46 responding, top open-ended responses)

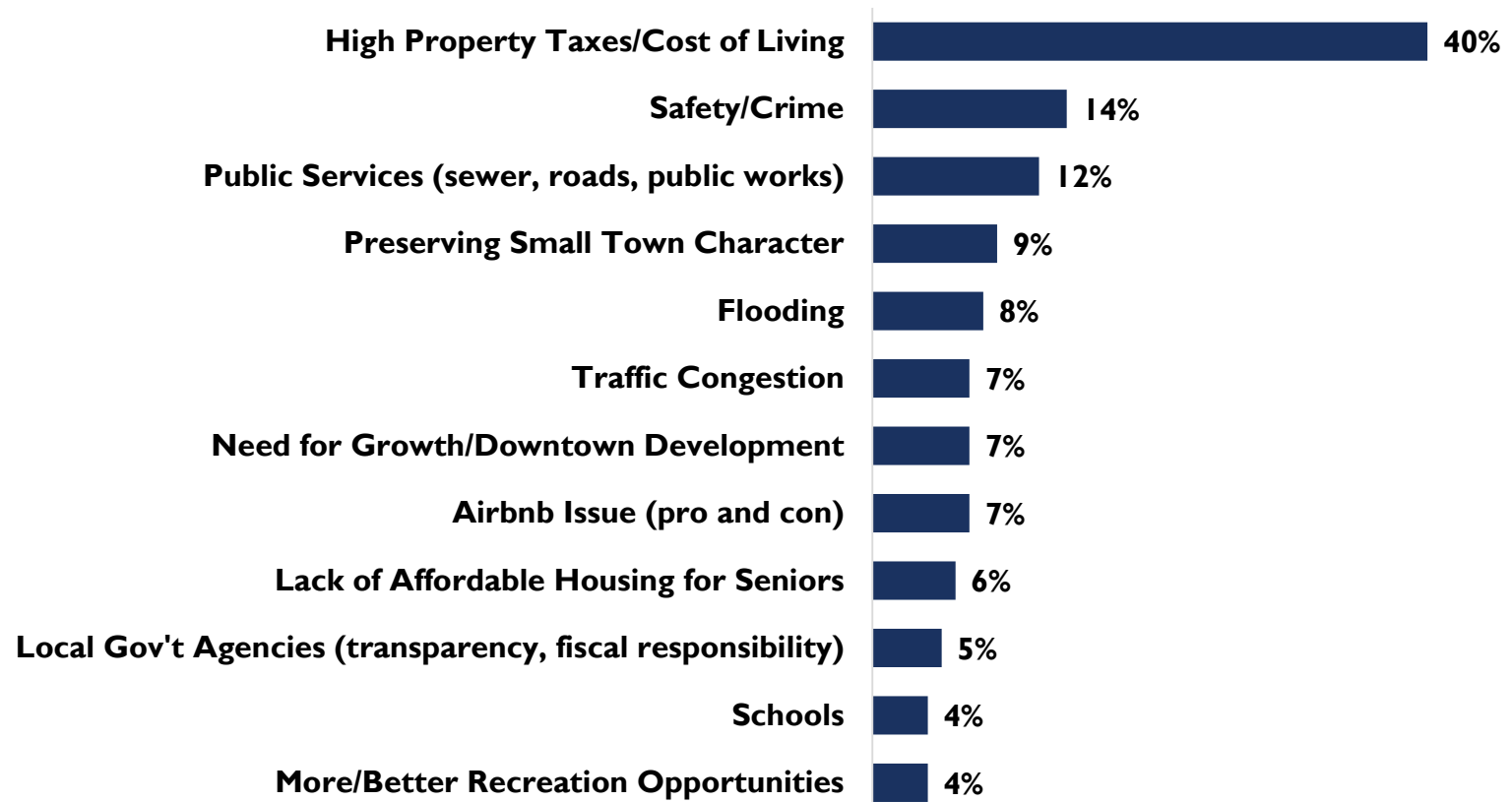
