PASTOR'S MESSAGE

What a beautiful Spring! I have crocus in bloom and daffodils and tulips breaking through the soil as you read this! Even with this glory of Easter and new birth upon us, we have the daily decisions, sometimes difficult ones, before us as well.

Most people see their difficult decisions as between two seemingly opposable options, and this indecision might go on too long. There seems to be no other way, but in Christ there's always a third way. This third way is a creative solution unseen by most, and is not always a compromise but somethings completely new.

We as humans are always looking for simple answers to complex questions. When we are faced with creating a solution rather than just saying 'No', we need to make sure that our 'No' is not because we have been intellectually lazy or unwilling to do the necessary legwork to open a space for God to work in our lives. In Christ there is always something new that could happen for the best outcome.

Third-way people get more of what they want out of life. They seem more fulfilled. They're the people that others look at and ask, "How did you do that?" or "What did you do to deserve that?" What they did is to faithfully envision through the eyes of Christ, a creative solution rather than simply making a choice between the options presented.

Jesus was a third way creator. He also calls us into this way of being in the world. When we are willing to take the time and the effort to look for the new way to resolve conflict, we are following Christ. Isn't that what He did? He was unwilling for people to continue to be victims of the Roman Empire, and He was unwilling to fight back in some violent way. So He resisted in other ways in the oppressive society including resisting against some victims [the leaders of the Pharisees and Sadducees] who had compromised their own values in order to not be aligned with the most victimized.

Jesus' third way was to purposely and lovingly align himself beside the most victimized, even to the point of the purposeful Cross as a choice. Not only does the Cross provide hope for the oppressed, but it also gives grace and opportunity of redemption for the oppressor. All oppressors are also victims as they don't realize the communal blessings of all people in the family of humanity.

Let us take up the Cross of Christ, not as victims, but as the ones who love all people. We are the Easter People. Praise God!

Jan Block presented the information again about the Living Last Supper. She needs to get us on their schedule in order to have them during Lent of 2018. After Jan presented and left, Rev Beth gave a devotion on the Velveteen Rabbit.

Please note the following change: Deborah Circle will meet on Thursday, <u>April 6</u> at the home of JoAnn Samuelson.


