PASTOR'S MESSAGE

As I write this last *Good News* letter, thinking of how grateful I am to have known and served here, I am inspired by a show I am currently watching that I have been so impressed with these last few months. *The Voice* is a show that on the surface is a competition that is about one person winning a singing contest for a \$100,000 and a recording contract.

I say 'on the surface' because it is clear to me that this program is about promoting and developing gifts of as many young singers as possible. Professionals and novices alike –even before the finalists are picked, each singer that auditions is given encouragement in some way, and each singer that moves forward is encouraged to do their very best. Constructive criticism is received well, as those that are most highly respected are the ones giving of their expertise in humble and caring ways.

No matter what genre that they will sing, no matter their background, all the coaches and all the other singers are encouraging each other, encouraging a different flavor, brand, style, or 'religion' in the 'One Song' [Uni Verse]. What a model of sharing gifts! This is the 12th season of this show and this show has learned this along the way. Often, it is the ones that don't win the show that have made it as popular vocalists in the singing business.

But I want to lift up again that all are encouraged to share their VOICE with feeling and faithful self identity (identify with the Christ.) It becomes clear pretty quickly that all the coaches and contestants are supportive and hoping that all are able to do their best. A Christian witness? I think so! Have you found your voice? I hope that each moment draws you closer to bringing the vibrations of your own soul forth to the beat of your own drum, whether it is singing praise for God's providence, speaking out about a social justice issue, or shouting for joy!

In this last show, they brought back many people who had been left behind in the contest. They sang wonderfully! This promotion of 'losers' is profound! Salute to the leaders of this program that has evolved its purpose to what is really wanted/ and needed for the audience to 'keep their attention'. That seems to be what most listeners are after anyway, right? They want to be relevant. They want to lead meaningful lives. They need to give something that is appreciated. By trial and error, the leaders, hosts, and coaches of this show have honed this philosophy of encouragement and grace, that all might be winners..... including the audience!!!

In the wake of the latest hateful acts in Manchester, England; in the tiredness of political frustration; in the fear of nuclear war in the back of our minds..... I have hope and belief that we are learning, too. I believe that hope and love will embrace fear and hate with reassurance and grace until they are healed and integrated into the Oneness of God's diverse acceptance.

April 20 , 2017

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Administrative Session of the Lake City Union Church was held in the Fireside Room-- 7:05pm. Before opening we went to the sanctuary for a preview of the web site that Julia Jacobs and Janelle Nesbitt have been working on. Meeting was called to order. **Attendance:** Jim Angove and Maria Bixenstine. Lisa Findley, Mike Jacobs, Nancy Jansen, Randy Kent, Austin Olberding, Paige Reiter, Brooke Schleisman , Karen Steig ,Maurine Thieszen Rev Beth and Kay Streeter. Excused: George Schaffer. Absent: Jon Myers. Rev Beth gave the opening devotion and prayer.

Session Minutes: March 16, 2017 meeting were read. A motion was made to approve both the regular meeting minutes and the special meeting of March 26, seconded and approved.

Clerk's Report: The April Clerk's report was read and a motion was made and seconded to approve. Approved

Christian Education: Janelle Nesbitt reported that the Wednesday evening youth groups are going well. There was a baptism at the April 19th service and next week the 26th will be the final gathering of the youth until fall. Vacation Bible School will be the last week of July at the Woodlawn Christian Church. Seniors will be recognized on Sunday May 5 during worship service.

Buildings and Grounds: There are on going projects - cement repairs in front of the church, and still working on the boilers and thermostats.

Staff Pastor Parish: The workshop Sunday, March 19 was in Rockwell, Iowa instead of Rockwell City and Maurine did make it in plenty of time. A meeting was held with Rev. Gillespie concerning the announcement that Rev Beth has been called to the Fairfield church as of July 1. He brought information for the committee to be able to start the process of getting Interims, committees and etc. for the procedure of a minister from the Presbytery. An on line vote to committee members was taken in order to approve the changing of the locks at the Parish House-- approved. Rev Russom was with us to explain the steps to get started.
