## BLACK HISTORY MONTH REFLECTING ON OUR HISTORY

### Katherine Coleman Goble Johnson

Katherine Johnson was born in White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia, August 26, 1918. She is the Math Whiz behind Hidden Figures. She joined the NASA's predecessor, the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics (NACA) in 1953. During this time the Langley, Virginia office was still segregated. She worked at the Black campus with other Black employees until it was changed. She calculated the path for Alan Shepard's historic flight in 1961 he became the first American to reach space and she verified the calculations a computer had made for John Glenn's historic first orbital mission.

She worked 35 years for NASA she earned a reputation for mastering complex manual calculations and helped pioneer the use of computers to perform the task. She was one of the first African American to work as a scientist for NASA. She graduated Summa Cum Laude in 1937 with a B.S. degree from West Virginia State she worked as physicist and a mathematician. She has three daughters. Katherine states "We needed to be assertive as women in those days and aggressive we had to be that way depended on where you were." No women in her division at NASA had their names on cards men would steal her ideas until her supervisor found out she was the actual brains behind the entire operations. This part is depicted in the movie "Hidden Figures" played by Tarji P. Henson. From 1958 until her retirement in 1986, Johnson worked as an aerospace technologist, moving during her career to the Spacecraft Controls Branch. She's received many awards for her wonderful achievements here's a few of them: in 1971, 1980, 1984, 1985, 1986 NASA Langley Research Center Special Achievement Award, the Honor Doctor of Laws from SUNY Farmington, in 1999, West Virginia State College Outstanding Alumnus of the Year, February 22, 2019 NASA renamed the Independent Verification and Validation Facility to the Katherine Johnson Facility April 29, 2019 honorary degree from the University of South Africa and November 8, 2019 Congressional Gold Medal. Katherine is still living at age 101 and active God bless her we love her and we are truly thankful for her contributions to America and the African American experience and the world.
