In the 14th century, Shenley was a convenient parish for an estate, within reach of London. It was the clean air in contrast to the smoke of London that made it a healthy place to live. village grew to house the families This providing a services for the country estates. Parish registers, date back to 1657, and include the occupations of coachmen, bailiffs, bakers and labourers. Many people worked in agriculture, as cattle drovers, shepherds and millers. Among Craftsmen in Shenley we found tailors, weavers, shoemakers, cord-makers, brick-makers, blacksmiths and carpenters.

However, we have expanded the original concept. Our event will celebrate all the communities of this now - diverse town.

Jewish and black performers will entertain together. People from Poland will chat with guys from Ghana. We will share food, art, our life-stories and our hopes and fears for the future , whilst celebrating our common humanity.

King George V and Queen Mary opened it in 1934. Shenley Hospital lasted for over 60 years, later sold to property developers for housing. Shenley Park was developed for the enjoyment of the village with the preservation of the orchard and spinney for pleasant walks. The walled garden was landscaped the and open to public and plays host to a number of events throughout the year. There is a well-used teashop called the caté in the Orchard. Shenley is the home Arsenal Football Club, training tacilities and was opened in 2000. Shenley Cricket Centre, plays host to the women's and U19 international matches during the summer months. The heart of the centre is the magnificent 19th-century pavilion, designed by the famous cricketer W. G. Grace. The cricketing theme runs throughout most of the road names on the Porters Park housing estate.

I have been taken to task for referring to 'container' homes and getting involved in local politics. I am concerned with the quality of our democracy in Borehamwood and so must refer to what I see as abuses regardless of party. By the way, the official name is 'modular units'.

Since civilisation began rulers have used confusing language to hide their reality. I first became aware of this when the Nixon administration used the words 'collateral damage' to describe their continuing slaughter of innocent villagers in bombing raids in Vietnam.

Here is the reality.



Let us be clear. The English language belongs to the people who speak it. We the people have made the language by using it. For example, we decided to pronounce 'mutton' as 'mutn' or /'mAt(ə)n/. And 'mutn' is correct.

Modern English has developed from a time when everyone was familiar with the King James Version of the Bible, dignified and resonant in public readings. Nursery rhymes are fine examples of clear English. Officialdom would take 'The King was in his counting house counting out his money, the Queen was in the parlour eating bread and honey' and render it with a pinch of awe, as 'His majesty was engaged in affairs of state while the Queen dined alone'.

In 2012 many families on benefit received a notice of an under occupancy penalty. What could that be? It's a penalty, so the claimant, let's say a woman, has done something wrong. She is under occupying. What remedy? Should she buy a fish tank or put up more shelves? She asks at the furniture store, How do I fully occupy my place? Well, ma'am it's the Bedroom Tax. How many bedrooms do you have? My disabled husband and I are in one and our 14-year-old twin boys are in the other and we have a box room. There it is - you have one bedroom too many. Now if you had a teenage daughter she could go in the box room and you would not be under occupied. So, it's an 'under reproducing penalty' as well!

When people use language to confuse us, they disrespect us. We should expect every respect from those we elect. When Winston Churchill addressed our people at war did he describe it like Rupert Brook "Honour has come back, as a king, to earth, And paid his subjects with a royal wage; And Nobleness walks in our ways again; And we have come into our heritage"? No! He said, "I have nothing to offer but blood, toil, tears, and sweat".

Ask your friend what is a modular unit and you'll get a blank stare; or maybe hear I did a college course once and it was divided into modular units. We should call out any councillor or MP who uses language to obfuscate! By naming them 'container homes' do we demean those who live in them? No more than we demean the poorest of a third world country when we say they live in shantytowns. They cannot help it. If these homes are imposed, we should and will sympathise with those who have no choice but to live in them. And if so, can we hope that the council might fund a 'Get to know you' initiative to make sure these temporary residents of Borehamwood can show their humanity and feel welcome?

Hello again dear reader.

Today, I'll be talking about cancer in general and specifically breast cancer. It is a fact that many

It is a tact that many people live in dread of cancer,

either because they've heard of its devastating effect on the health, finances, and poor prognosis with dire complications in others. Or unfortunately have had firsthand knowledge of cancer affecting either themselves or a close relative.

As you may know, cancer can affect almost all the body organs and there's currently a lot of research to finding out about the causes and successful treatment of different kinds of cancer to reduce the sheer numbers affected by this dreadful disease. We in general practice are also attending refreshers to pick up cancer early but you dear reader have a part to play.

The Silver Lining (as I always like to give you one) is that many of the cancers we know can be prevented or the effect ameliorated by a healthy lifestyle (i.e. avoiding smoking and excessive eating with regular exercise such as walking, jogging or simply going up and down the stairs at home several times a day) and early detection.

Certainly in the case of breast cancer (which affects mostly females but can occasionally affect

Adopting a routine of breast self-examination at least once a month, e.g. after the menstrual period is certainly helpful in detecting any changes that were not previously there.

These changes can then be mentioned to the general practitioner who will also examine the breast and take the necessary action to refer it to reassure as needed.

In my last TV series which was also on this topic. Our guest had self detected her own lump which unfortunately turned out to be breast cancer.

She was at the time of diagnosis, a young mother whose only child had just started reception but because she picked it up, as she herself said, when it was the size of "a kidney bean" she survived!!

She underwent a successful treatment with chemotherapy and radiotherapy and some surgery and is alive and well today 8 years after her breast cancer experience to literally tell the tale.

This example shows us that self breast examination is definitely part of the fight against breast cancer.

I see many women in my clinic who have heard about the self examination but say to me "I don't even know what I'm looking for and I don't know how to check my breasts and so I teach these women how to check their own breasts.

If you are in that category please look on my Facebook page www.facebook/ Nonnierose.5 to watch a demonstration of the breast examination.

The incidence of cancer increases with age, so from age 50 the NHS sends out letters for three yearly mammogram screening which will also help to detect any abnormal lumps.

Please endeavour to attend these free health checks as it is a very good service and doesn't take long and is at worst a little bit uncomfortable.

That you had a normal screen, however, doesn't stop you from checking your own breast in between as it's better to be vigilant on these issues.

I look forward to hearing your stories and please keep healthy.



On the 7th of May our photographer and petrol head Derek Allen and myself, went by bus to Brent Cross to test-drive the all-electrical Tesla 3 car. Estimated to be About 600 HP priced

at £71,000. The salesman Alex took us out the M1 and the power of this fully electrical car was amazing. He touched the accelerator and within 3 seconds we advanced to 70 MPH. It was so silent you could hear a pin drop if the air conditioning was not on. I was to sit behind the wheel after we reached the Service station on the M1. I was cautious and careful for this car was huge and wider than most cars on the British roads.

Once on the motorway, I was able to put it through its paces and I found it was easy to reach 86 MPH in 3 seconds before quickly slowing down within 2 seconds to 30 mph. This was superior to any petrol or diesel car I have ever driven since I passed my test in 1966. No handbrake. You just push the footbrake down and that acts as the handbrake. I found it slowed down in 2 seconds from 60mph by just removing my foot from the accelerator to stop at the traffic lights. Within a few hundred yards I had to turn right towards Hendon. Instant acceleration not equaled by any petrol or diesel vehicle. You can shock other road users by how fast it can move. When my boat comes home I would be happy to purchase an all-electrical car. Not quite as large. They are introducing a smaller model estimated cost £35.000. I am saving up now.

Useful facts. Up to 400 miles on one full charge. On a supercharger, 20 minutes will give you up to 200 miles. A camera at the back of the car guides you into reverse. Open the boot or the bonnet no engine or mechanical parts are visible. All you see is the cover for all mechanical parts. No exhaust to be seen and it does not require engine oil. 8,000 encased AAA batteries they claim will last up to 20 years. The only checks you need to make are your tyre pressures and make sure you have enough charge in your batteries to reach the next power point.



I had a vision of a woman crossing the road by the Public House, The Artichoke and а car speeding down the hill and a woman being thrown in the air by the force of the impact and landing on her head instantly killing her in a pool of blood. I forced myself to walk faster until I reached The Artichoke pub and before the car was visible I pulled this woman off the road. She screamed at me to let go of her arm hitting me with her handbag. The sound of the car and the speed paused her action against me as the car swerved to avoid an oncoming car and crashed into the front of a private house before bursting into flames. Knowing the woman was safe I hurried away. Later in my relived life I was to marry her. Another vision occurred as I was about to board a bus for Boreham Wood from Elstree outside the Fishery Pub. I visualised this bus overturning as it went into Allum Lane. I decided not to take this bus even though I would be late for work, as the next bus would not come for another 15 minutes. The next bus was on time and as we proceeded up toward the traffic lights the volume of vehicles was much larger than usual on this summer afternoon.

Cars coming towards us told of a bus crash on the road to Radlett. My vision was proven correct. Later I was to find out that 20 people on that bus had been injured and 4 had died.

I had an interview for a job in the Village Boreham Wood. I remembered that I had taken the job but it was poorly paid and the boss was later to face a criminal charge of buying shares in his own company with money from his own company. Many of the employees faced redundancy and no payment of wages. In 1952 it was not compulsory for employers to pay redundancy or wages. I decided not to take the job and accepted a job in nearby Edgware at the local main post office.

I learned the job well as a postal and telegraph officer and my expertise and ability was noticed by the Midland Bank and found myself working there and reaching the dizzy heights of Branch Manager.

I had taken the position with the Insurance Company before the reliving of my life and going into the Royal Mail. I found myself implicated in a robbery that took place in this company It had resulted in my being convicted of the crime and spending 5 years in prison.

Out of prison and nobody would employ me. I adopted a life of crime and got mixed up with a notorious underworld gang dealing in drugs and firearms. Eventually I got caught and spent a further 10 years in jail. I never did learn my lesson that crime does not pay and was offered a lucrative employment as a hired assassin. I was contracted to eliminate senior members of the legal profession I killed 3 of them before I was involved in a hostage situation where I had ordered the employees of a bank to lay on the floor. CUISINE COLUMN

AALOO PAKORAS (POTATO FRITTERS)

INGREDIENTS

1 cup gram flour 2 medium potatoes Salt to taste Red chilli powder 1/2 teaspoon (optional) Garam masala 1/2 teaspoon Carom seeds 1/2 teaspoon Water Oil for frying

METHOD

Wash and peel the potatoes.

TRIFD & TRUSTED

Cut them into thin round slices.

In a bowl take gram flour and add salt, red chilli powder, garam masala and carom seeds. Mix it well.

Now add water to it while continuously stirring it so that there are no lumps, keep adding water till you get a consistency of cake batter (it should be a little runny).

Now add the potatoes to batter and coat them nicely.

Heat the oil for frying.

Once the oil is hot, bring the heat to medium and one by one add the coated potatoes to hot oil.

Let them fry for a few minutes till they are golden. Take them out of oil and drain the excessive oil on kitchen towel.

They are ready to served hot with mint and coriander chutney.

You can also sprinkle some chat masala on them.
