Prairie Evers by Ellen Airgood follows the 10-year old protagonist named Prairie and her adventures in friendship. After moving from North Carolina to the Big Apple, Prairie goes to school for the first time after years of being homeschooled. A girl named Ivy Blake is also an outsider, but unlike Prairie, she comes from a broken home.
