Wow, did we ever get a lot of work accomplished before and during our board

meeting on February 22, 2019. To begin with there was great shareholder attendance and interest in the work at hand. That along with board members coming to the meeting prepared to get concerns resolved made for a great meeting.

Our meeting began with Tim opening up with a list of Old Business items. At a high level this included notification to those present that:

- As a result of our Annual Meeting and Election our board will remain unchanged through 2019.
- Tree trimming projects are on schedule and within budget.
- Installation of an emergency generator and associated propane tank for the clubhouse were approved.
- Cost benefit for the clubhouse front porch was held over to the next meeting.
- It was reported that the Prospectus Update Team is making good progress with required updates.
- All Home Town Wireless towers have been taken down and removed from the park on schedule.
- New wrist bands will be available at the office for visitors use at park facilities for identification.

• A request was made that all residents place trash for pickup on the same side as the mail box.

In addition to the pending Old Business several New Business items were raised and addressed as follows:

- It was approved that we will move forward with an updated Reserve Study for the park.
- It was reported that all fire safety equipment in the clubhouse was inspected and updated to meet Florida code.
- Lighting concerns for the dog run will be evaluated further and updated at the next meeting.
- Lighting concerns for the clubhouse will be addressed by the addition of a new street light and some minor tree trimming. This will begin shortly.
- HOA Board Meeting attendance was discussed resulting in a determination to leave things as they are currently.
- Duke Energy will be doing a Wire Road transmission line and substation update in the near future. This may result in some short power outages. The board will work with Duke to try to keep all residents as informed as possible about times.

Finally, I want to be sure all residents are aware of fee payment requirements in the park. Over the past several months there has been some misunderstanding and misleading information coming from our office, as well as, a failure to enforce late fees. Our Prospectus draws specific reference to the requirements for time line of these payments and associated late charges which we are to follow. Effective March 1, 2019 we will be enforcing payment schedules as identified in the Prospectus. Emergency situations will be considered by the board on a case by case basis but unless the board approves an exception all residents will be held to this payment schedule for fees and late charges. If you wish to review this portion of the Prospectus Carla can provide a copy in the office.

Reminder

(These Rules and Regulations pertain to share- holders, non-shareholders as well as guests, visitors, renters, tenants, lessees, or sub-lessees)

I. THE MOBILE/MANUFACTURED HOME AND LOT Part #2

E. Cable TV service has been installed with connections at each home site. Any

outside antennas that will interfere with other communications, i.e., TV, radio, or internet are prohibited. Certain exterior antennas may be allowed at the clubhouse for the beneficial use by management, such as CB antennas and equipment helpful during storms or other disasters. Satellite dishes may be put on a pole in the ground adjacent to the home.

F. "Garage Sales", "Carport Sales", or "Yard Sales", etc., are not permitted. Such sales may be scheduled for total park participation by the Social Club and held at the clubhouse or designated areas as appropriate. These may be scheduled upon request by the residents twice per year.

G. Freestanding structures are not permitted (for example, storage buildings). This does not apply to such structures as may be used by park management and placed on park property other than a mobile/manufactured home space.

H. Any exterior alterations or permanent improvements to the mobile/ manufactured home or lot must be approved by management. All required permits must be obtained and posted on the home with a copy to the office.

I. Carports and surrounding areas of the mobile/manufactured home must be kept clear at all times of any and all items and said areas must not be used for storage. This is for the public health, safety and welfare of all residents and will ensure an attractively maintained lot. If a resident wishes to make an exception to this rule, the resident must obtain permission from the Spanish Trails West Homeowners Assn. Board of Directors. Bear in mind that carports should be cleared of all items when there is an approaching storm due to the danger of flying debris.



Don't forget to set your clocks one hour ahead on Sunday, March 10th as Daylight Saving Time starts at 2:00 a.m.

St. Patrick's Day Facts Did You Know

March 17,461 marks the death of St. Patrick, who died in Saul, County Down where he had established his first small church in a simple barn. It is the celebration of his life and the beginning of Christianity in Ireland. For those who celebrate its intended meaning, St. Patrick's Day is a traditional day for spiritual renewal.

There are many things associated with the holiday, such as wearing shamrocks, drinking festivities and going green. As Christianity was just starting to make its way into Ireland, St. Patrick used the threeleafed clover to demonstrate the Holy Trinity. The clover, already having been a sacred image in pre-Christianity Ireland, was adopted as the central symbol of St. Patrick's Day.

The reason the tradition of wearing green is strange is that the color that was most commonly associated with Saint Patrick himself was actually blue. However, as a result of wearing green ribbons and shamrock to celebrate St. Patrick's Day, Green became the color associated with the holiday.
