For those of us who remain we sure are seeing summer coming early. Temps in the mid-90s already are seemingly here to stay. All we need now is for the rain to start again so we can get both of our fountains running.

Now for remaining board members we have several new challenges to keep the park in great condition for all residents. To move forward with required park updates the Board had a very productive May board meeting. Our meeting began with Tim opening with up a summarized list of required activities to allow us to move forward. Business discussed and decisions made at high level were as follows:

- Tim reported that the Generac emergency generator installation scheduled for the clubhouse remains on track to complete as planned and within budget.
- Warranty work on the pool is progressing well with the general over-all condition of the pool improving.
- Jack is working with the board and residents to schedule required tree trimming.
- Plans for work this summer are now set to focus on the clubhouse and shuffleboard court structures. Bids have been gathered and vendors selected for the required work. These bids are with our lawyers for review to ensure we have viable work agreements to complete required activities. When completed these efforts will result in:
  - Replacement of the clubhouse roof

- New updated storm gutters on the clubhouse
- Repair of shuffleboard building gutters
- Replacement of some clubhouse windows
- Replacement of shuffleboard building windows
- Restructure of our existing security systems using ADT
- Stones around the pool will be washed, sanded and sealed
- A new sound system for the clubhouse was approved and is scheduled for completion during June of this year.
  - Instead of a drop-down screen we found it is less costly to employ a wide screen smart television.
     Work is moving forward to install this large screen television to complement clubhouse updates.
- As a result of increased demand with new resident requirements we are going back to the original forms for space in the storage area down by the shed. Each share-holder will be required to fill out a form and space will be made available on a first come basis. Note: All vehicles stored in this area must be licensed and noncommercial in nature to be there. Spaces will be limited to one per share holder. Jack Pugh will be working on this over the summer months.

As you can see, we will be very busy over the next several weeks making all this work happen. We will make every effort to accomplish these activities while keeping access to the clubhouse and pool open. We appreciate your patience while we get this done.
