Wow, we as a Board continue to be very busy during this summer season. Between the many rainstorms and threats of tropical storms, scheduled work in the park continues even though there have been some unexpected delays.

Please take a minute to check this out:

- We continue to press forward to have the installation of the emergency generator completed ASAP. As a result of several false starts and failure to properly size the generator requirements on their part, we are now receiving a different upgraded generator at no additional cost to the park. Installation of this generator is now nearing completion despite our having to use legal pressure to keep it on track.
- Work on the pool continues to keep it up to our standards for the park. We

are currently looking for a different company to take over the ongoing maintenance. You will be kept up to date on these activities.

- Tree trimming continues both in the park common areas and for private residents.
- A great deal of work has been focused on the clubhouse and shuffleboard court structures. Work is moving forward on several fronts:
  - Our clubhouse roof was completely replaced and looks great.
  - New updated storm gutters are in place on the clubhouse.
  - Repair of shuffleboard building gutters is nearing completion.
  - Replacement of some clubhouse windows has been completed. New blinds have been ordered and are scheduled for installation on September 27<sup>th</sup>.
  - Replacement shuffleboard building windows have been completed. New blinds have been ordered and are scheduled for installation on September 27<sup>th</sup>.
  - Our existing security system has been completely replaced using ADT.
  - There is one hurdle remaining with the front entrance as it relates to equipment cooling. We are working on that now.
  - A new sound system for the clubhouse has been purchased and installed.

- A new large screen intelligent television has been installed in the clubhouse for use in presentations, movies etc.
- On July 26<sup>th</sup> the air conditioner in the park office failed. The unit has been replaced and will be on the agenda for the next board meeting for approval.
- Upgrades to an existing power company easement have been completed.
- Assignment of spaces for utility vehicles for park residents is well under way.

As you can see this has been a very busy place over the past several weeks and have completed nearly all scheduled work activities to date. During this time, we have made every effort to accomplish these activities while keeping access to the club house and pool open. We appreciate your patience while we get this done. I hope all residents are pleased with the results of these efforts.
