Wow our new year is getting started right where we left off last year. We had a great annual meeting and really appreciate the participation of all shareholders.

Items of concern which were both covered in the annual meeting and ongoing are as follows:

 We continue to press forward with the installation of the emergency generator. Our board has decided to move forward using Martin Electric of Dade City and Bahr's Propane to finalize the installation requirements. Martin Electric will be installing a different larger generator which will handle the load for the clubhouse. Bahr's will purchase the generator which is on site and will provide the necessary plumbing changes for the propane. There will be no payment requirements with this update until the new generator is on site, tested and passes inspection.

- We continue to work on a plan to implement the card access portion of our new ADT Security System. Additional cards have been ordered and delivered to ADT to meet our needs in this area. Joe and Ernie are continuing to work out the details and we hope to move on shortly. Once in place this will result in residents using a card to gain access to the clubhouse. As we move forward, we will keep you posted on progress.
- We have resolved the one hurdle which was remaining with the front entrance equipment cooling. Cameras are now up and operational but still experiencing network issues. We are working with ADT and Spectrum to resolve this now.

As I am sure you now know we did not have an election for the three board vacancies this year. This is due mainly to a lack of shareholders who are willing to serve on the board. Even though two of the existing board members have agreed to continue on the board we currently have one opening which remains. This opening is to replace Joe Williams who has completed his term on the board. In addition to Joe, Carol Beacroft has told us she will be leaving shortly. Remaining board members have determined that the best way to fill these

vacancies is through utilization of a nominating committee. Participants on this committee will meet with persons who express an interest to serve and make recommendation to the board for consideration to determine who will be called for the board. In the event you have determined you would like to be considered to fill one of these vacancies please either contact a committee member or let Carla know. Members are Tom Pete, Jack Pugh and Charlie Deane.

Both Carol and Joe will really be missed. They have both been valuable assets to the board spending much of their personal time for no pay. When you see them please let them know their efforts are appreciated.
