Office Hours

Currently the office is still staffed from 8:00 a.m. until noon, Monday through Friday. In order to practice federally mandated safe distancing, we are keeping the office doors locked. We ask everyone to either mail or put their payments in the drop box outside the office door.

<u>Electronic Key Cards:</u> The Board has suspended the implementation of the electronic key cards for entrance into the clubhouse. Key cards will not be available from the office until further notice.

Notification will go out as to when the implementation of electronic key card usage and key card availability from the office will be sent out within the next month, after we know more about the Coronavirus activity in our area.

Pool: The pool is currently **open**. <u>Pool usage is at your own risk</u>. The Board recommends <u>against</u> using the pool as COVID19 is in our area. <u>Please exercise</u> social distancing.

<u>Lot Number:</u> Please remember to put your lot number on your checks so your payment is posted to the correct account.

<u>Guests:</u> If you are having company, please stop by and pick up a pass to go on their vehicle and a wristband for each person.

<u>Contractors:</u> If you are having work done, please have your contractor stop by the office to register and get a parking pass.

Statements: Are sent out around the 10th of each month to accounts with a balance due. If you feel there is an error, please contact the office so we can clear it up. We try to email as many statements and invoices as possible to save on postage.

<u>Vehicle Stickers:</u> Residents, if you don't already have a STW sticker on your vehicle, please pick one up at the office.

<u>Trash:</u> Trash is picked up on Monday and Thursday at <u>9:00 a.m</u>. Please do not put your trash out the night before as we have a problem with critters getting into it and making a mess. If you put cardboard boxes into the dumpsters, please cut the tape holding them together, and fold them down to take up less space.

March really has been an eventful month. I am happy to report that effective with our Emergency Board Meeting on 3/19/2020 Joe Williams is once again on the board. This said, we now have all nine directors in place on the board.

In addition to calling Joe back to serve on the board, several items of concern were discussed and agreed to by the board as follows:

- We continue to press forward with the installation of the emergency generator. Our new generator is in place on site and all that remains is the final run test. We hope to have this completed 3/20/2020.
- We will continue to keep the pool open as long as possible. We have asked Polly to wipe down all tables, chairs, railings and door handles with disinfectant three times a day. COVID-19 developments will be monitored as we continue to do all we can to keep it open and safe.
- There will be no regular Board meetings scheduled until the COVID-19 emergency passes. Should the need arise in the meantime Tim will schedule an Emergency Board Meeting to meet the park requirements.
- As of now we will continue to keep all other amenities open for individual needs. There may not be any scheduled gathering such as bingo, shows etc. If you want to go to the library in the clubhouse or play a private game of shuffle; that is okay. If

- the situation gets worse Tim may need to implement further restrictions.
- Carla will be working in the office as usual starting Monday, March 23rd with the exception that she will not have the window or office door open. For safety sake please call the office on the phone if you need to talk with Since Carla's responsibilities require her to interact with a large percentage of our residents, should she be exposed and/or contract the virus she would have the potential to infect a very large cross section of our neighbors. In addition, we would ask that you drop checks etc. in the drop box. Let's stay safe!
- Polly will be working her normal hours through the week. For both her and your safety we ask that you limit contact with her. Since Polly's work responsibilities require her to work across the park, should she be exposed and/or contract the virus she would have the potential to infect a very large cross section of our neighbors.
- Mowing crews will be working their normal days during this emergency.
 Once again, for both their and your safety please limit any contact with these folks. These folks also work across the entire park and have the same potential to spread the virus.
- Our board voted to give Ernie Foote (Treasurer) authority to move park funds between banks as required to keep our financials on track. If Ernie is not available Joe Williams will fill this need and Tim will monitor the activities.

As you are aware, we continue to hear new updates almost on an hourly basis related to this virus. Even though this is a scary problem we can do a lot to limit our exposure and spreading of the disease. Our board has taken the above listed actions in response to recommendations from our attorneys and Bill Gorman. Any and all are intended to keep people in the community safe and secure. If you have concerns, please give either Tim or Tom Pete a call and let them know.

Finally, many of our northern neighbors are either leaving soon or have already left. For those of us who are left, let's pull together and work our way through this emergency.

Reminder

Spanish Trails West, Rules and Regulations

(These Rules and Regulations pertain to share-holders, non-shareholders as well as guests, visitors, renters, tenants, lessees, or sub-lessees.)

Once again, I remind everyone of the Rules and Regulations particularly for the pool with emphasis on the hours of use and Florida Statutes.

IV. RECREATIONAL FACILITIES

The Spanish Trails West Community Social Club Inc.'s sole purpose is to provide social and related activities for the residents. These events will be reflected in the Social Club's monthly newsletter and calendar. The newsletter will be delivered to all residents and the calendar will also be posted on the bulletin boards.

A. Recreational facilities are proved for the use of the residents. Guests under eighteen (18) years of age must be accompanied by one of the residents with whom they are visiting when using any recreational facility.

B. Rules regarding each facility, i.e., clubhouse, pool, shuffleboard, etc., will be posted for your safety and convenience in the respective areas.

C. Hours that each recreational facility will be open will be posted at each area. These hours will be strictly adhered to unless special arrangements are made with management.

M. <u>Swimming Pool:</u> Although the swimming pool is listed in the prospectus as a facility available for use by the residents, the use of the swimming pool is a privilege. There is no lifeguard on duty so swim at your

own risk. All persons must shower before entering the pool. Oil is not permitted to be worn in the pool. Children under eighteen (18) years of age must be accompanied by an adult. Children under three (3) years of age may not use the pool at any time. Diving or jumping into the pool is forbidden. Please do not swim alone.

Management may from time to time post rules at poolside governing its use, which may include hours of operation, etc. A resident who violates swimming pool rules may be subject to eviction as set forth in sections 723.061 or 719.105 Florida Statutes. N. Please treat facilities as you would your own personal property and abide by all posted rules and these regulations. All equipment, rooms, etc., must be left in the same condition as you found them, including taking the trash to the dumpsters.
