I want to take this opportunity to thank our community at large for your support with activities which have been in process to maintain our park as such a great place to live. It looks now like our Spectrum conversion is nearing completion. I guess it was not without its little moments but overall, it went as well as could be expected. We now have one of the best rates for TV and internet in the area.

On October 18th we had our first Board Meeting following the summer break. There were several business concerns which were addressed and resolved during this meeting. Of primary importance is the Board's decision to recast our existing mortgage. Ernie Foote, Bill Gorman and Becca Gaddis presented an analysis of cash flow advantages and benefits associated with taking this action now. This action was and when completed approved eliminate the need to raise any fees for the immediate future. Additional actions were: Peggy Foote was recognized for her efforts over the past several weeks keeping the park office afloat. She was presented two gift certificates from great restaurants in the area as a small token of appreciation from park residents.

Carla Eno was introduced as the new office person who has been hired on a 90-day trial basis. I am confident Carla will work out fine and will be a great long-term addition to our park family.

Tim reported we now have a new pool company to help us keep our pool open and functioning properly.

Tim advised that he and the Social Club are working to procure a new roaster on wheels for the park. This unit will be used for future pig roasts, chicken barbeque, ribs etc. We are going to move forward to share the expense to add this to our park amenities.

A motion was taken and approved to move forward with replacement of the existing fountains. Funds for this will come from our reserve account and has been in the planning with the reserve study.

Clyde has put in a great deal of effort to attain drawings and estimates for an addition of an awning across the front of the clubhouse. It was determined that we will explore this further and look to add it to the budget for next year.

Payment of share sales funds which were realized since the last board meeting were identified and authorized for payment against our current mortgage.

In addition to these items we continue to request support from park residents with completion of small jobs such as trimming trees, bushes, weeding flower beds or possibly cleaning storm spouts. In the event you are not here or are unable to do the work yourself please take advantage of a work order which is available in the office. With the work order in hand the Grounds Manager will schedule the required job to take place either during down time or after hours. Hours worked will be noted on the work order upon completion and signed by the home owner. Residents will be billed at a rate of \$25.00 per hour. NOTE: the person completing the assigned work is not to receive the payment. STW office staff will invoice the homeowner for the hours worked based on the completed work order.

Finally, we need your support to use the new identification bracelets, maintain your property free of clutter, check in your guests with the office and get passes for their cars. Thank you for your help.

(These Rules and Regulations pertain to shareholders, non-shareholders as well as guests, visitors, renters, tenants, lessees, or sub-lessees)

IV. RECREATIONAL FACILITIES (Part #1)

The Spanish Trails West Community Social Club Inc.'s sole purpose is to provide social and related activities for the residents. These events will be reflected in the Social Club's monthly newsletter and calendar. The newsletter will be delivered to all residents and the calendar will also be posted on the bulletin boards.

- A. Recreational facilities are provided for the use of the residents. Guests under eighteen (18) years of age must be accompanied by one of the residents with whom they are visiting when using any recreational facility.
- B. Rules regarding each facility, i.e., clubhouse, pool, shuffleboard, etc., will be posted for your safety and convenience in the respective areas.
- C. Hours that each recreational facility will be open will be posted at each area. These hours will be strictly adhered to unless special arrangements are made with management.
- D. The clubhouse doors will automatically unlock each morning and automatically lock each evening at a set time. Hours are posted in the clubhouse. If hours need to be adjusted, please notify the office at least seventy-two (72) hours in advance.
- E. Equipment and facilities are to be used at your own risk.

- F. Pets are not permitted in any of the recreational areas.
- G. Bare feet or wet swimsuits are not permitted in the clubhouse. Bathroom facilities are located in the rear of the office.
