#### East Ohio Summer Camp – 2020



But spring is around the corner and summer can't be far away. The same can be said about your children and grandchildren, and maybe this is a good time to plant the seed about them going to summer camp.

East Ohio Camps have been making and maturing disciples for more than 50 years. The early visionaries saw the need for sites and programs where people could gather to experience spiritual birth, growth and renewal. There are thousands of people scattered around the world who would call East Ohio Camps their spiritual birthplace or home. Why can't you and your family become part of this rich history by participating in the 2020 Summer Camp program?

There are three camps in the conference: Aldersgate, Asbury and Wanake. The closest one is Camp Wanake which is located just down the road in Beach City. It is located on 250 acres. This camp is a modern facility with good leadership and counselors. Programs have been set up for youth from 1<sup>st</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade and run in June and July.
