## PRESIDENT'S REPORT DECEMBER 2019

December is well under way, Christmas and other holidays approaching fast.

I wish to thank our Branch Executive team, our members and the public for supporting us this year. We have lots to be proud of. We have held many events and partnered with many community groups to enhance our area.

#### Volunteers, I wish to thank each and every one of you!

This is in addition to our volunteer members who accepted executive positions, chairs and committee positions that require many, many, hours throughout the year.

- -The Ways & Means team raised funds by holding 20 spaghetti dinners & 3 breakfasts.
- -Our BBQ volunteers & staff cooked for over 250 days to encourage members and customers to stop in for lunch and perhaps have a beverage too. Also include in this group are the specialty functions such as the monthly Windsor Quilters Guild luncheons, Football parties, other Branch bus tours that come to visit, Branch Fun Golf Day
- -Branch Children's Christmas team
- -We had a small team of gardeners who cut grass, weed wacked, planted flowers, weeded, watered, weeded...
- -Painters for patching & repainting of parts of lounge and main hall
- -Building maintenance, Larry led the way, but many others have pitched in over the year
- -Sports equipment maintenance, repainting of dart scoreboards, pool tables (3 now!!!)
- -Poppy Campaign. There's more than meets the eye. Planning the campaign, pre-inventory, re-ordering (Poppies, wristbands, Poppy backs, wreaths, information packages...), receiving, assembly of retail boxes & pinners boxes, retail outlet contacting for approval to have boxes and pinners, retail box route management (delivering donation boxes, ensuring boxes have poppies through the campaign, changing out donation boxes as needed, final collection of boxes...), Poppy Pinning at major retail partners, counting and rolling thousands of dollars in coins, banking, reporting...
- -I am sure I have missed others and hope to add them & thank them.

#### **Membership**

- -Under your direction we have done a major upgrade to our building electronic systems. We now have a dependable WiFi system for both internal and customer use. Our control system now allows us to control all 8 sources, Cogeco TV, DVD, Satelite Radio and Air Media in the lounge, main hallway, and both rental halls. The Air media system provides the ability to wirelessly connect and show Legion and customer devices. This enhances our ability to book events that we could not previously handle.
- Under your direction we have replaced our 2 pool tables with 3 and have increased play and revenue as a result. Our first tournament will be the District 8 Ball on January 25, 2020

#### Acknolwledgements

I would like to thank the Windsor Essex Community Foundation for their donation toward our accessible entry and air lock at the north east corner of the building. With the cold weather upon us we find the problem of frigid air entering the building when people enter or exit the building has been remedied. Thank you WECF!

I would also like to our Federal Government for the New Horizons for Seniors grant we received. So far, we have the new comfort seating area in the main hallway and a new portable

sound system that has been used for many functions. The system allows those with less than perfect hearing (me included) to hear speakers clearly. We will soon have some new tables so we can continue host senior related and other events in our main hall. In the new year we will be replacing the fluorescent lighting in the main lounge area, washrooms and kitchen to better control light levels and reduce electrical consumption (lowering hydro bills too!)

**Events** this year included our annual Veterans Appreciation Dinner, Fundraiser for the Military Families Resource Centre & our Veterans Comfort fund, 75year anniversary of D-Day, Remembrance Day (-1) Service supported by our 2715 Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corp and 364 Lancaster Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron. Our 2019 Poppy Campaign had many new volunteers and funds raised exceeded last years.

We have hosted events for many traditional and non-traditional groups. These include, the Military Institute of Windsor, the University of Windsor Elder College, The Rotary Club, the Alzheimer's Association, North Wall Riders, Parks Canada / Naval Association of Windsor (Admiral Hose recognition), CAS, LaSalle Rowing Club, MTO, Sharpe Bus Lines, Safety Training, Silver Ambassadors...

The participation in these presentations has varied from just a few people to over 40 people attending. We are going to conduct a survey to get some feedback on this program and what needs to be changed to ensure a better turn out. A survey will be given to the Seniors' Dinner and Dance Group on 16 December to get some feedback, and we will have the survey at the bar for those who would like to fill one in.

#### **Next Planned Presentation:**

The Committee is working on a presentation for Monday, 13 January, commencing at 2 pm in Hall A. The topic with be EMS and a flyer will be available next week to provide the details. We hope to have a good turn out to this presentation.

#### Seniors' Dinner and Dance:


