Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper March 5th at 6:00pm



The origin of Shrove Tuesday comes from the idea of - the night before Lent begins consuming everything in the household from which one planned to abstain during Lent. We serve pancakes to connect us to the customs of a time when flour, eggs, milk, butter and other food items were all on the Lenten abstinence list. These days we celebrate the evening before Ash Wednesday more as a foretaste of the feast to come at Easter. (ELCA)

Friends,

The Lord be with you.

We've rounded the corner from Epiphany into Lent; hard to believe Ash Wednesday is upon us, March 6th. It seems like Christmas Eve was not so long ago.

Right now, as I type, the quilters have put me in a Lenten mood; they're putting together a lovely purple-themed quilt that makes Lent feel very present. And, soon it will be.



In the midst of Ash Wednesday's liturgy, we will hear:

"As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection." (ELW, Ash Weds liturgy) How do we receive what we hear? Will we receive what we hear as a call for personal, individual, moralistic perfectionism? Will we receive what we hear as God urging us to use the ancient tools of God's Church (prayer, fasting, Sacraments) to become both aware and penitent for the ways we make life dusty and ashen for self and others? How do we receive what we hear?

I suppose one way to receive what we hear is to allow it to motivate us to, "look for the monsters under our bed."

Don't we often live as though, by not looking under our metaphoric beds, the monsters won't get us? And, doesn't that keep us too afraid to look under the bed that is us, too afraid to profess our sin, too afraid to profess our disappointment, too afraid to profess our faithlessness, too afraid to profess our hopelessness, and ultimately, too afraid to profess our pervasive fear of death? Isn't this why we require the ancient tools of God's Church? Don't we require their ritual, sign, allegory, and power, to pry into the secret place within us, often kept secret even from ourselves, the space under the bed that is us, the space we're too ashamed to profess is there? Aren't those ancient tools what empowers us to look under our bed?

Why not use those tools, often and sincerely, as together with Jesus, we spend the next forty days looking under our beds?

Update for the coming year 2019

Property Group held their first meeting of the year on January 25, 2019. There were ten members from our Church present for the meeting. We were honored to have our Pastor John David Bryant sit in on our meeting with us and offer his advice and input, good turn out and a very productive meeting. John Manaseri will be Property Manager for the year. Ken Laumer was elected to be Assistant Property Manager.

Our first project for the start of the year was removal of the stage area in the church, moving the piano and organ, putting the wall in front of them, and opening up the space for more seating in our church. This will make our church look better and visitors will feel more welcome. Yes, this did and will cause other problems but they can be address as they arrive. And everyone has his or her idea of the lay out, but we listened to them all and made it happen. A good example of use of this new space was setting up for Bunco Night on Saturday February 9, 2019. We did not have to disrupt the whole church setting. It worked out great.

Here what's going on and still in the works!

The chair project is still on going and will be completed soon. There about eighty chairs left to be completed. Jim is refinishing the wood arm chairs. He is redoing the font base Too. The font will be completed by March first. Just in time for Lent services.

Ken has spear headed cleaning the brush along the fence and scrub brush on the property. It looks great but we still have a long way to go. So far, he has taking three or four trips to the land fill. This is ongoing project for a while. But will be worth it in the end.

The A/C unit in the lady's storage shed is leaking and rotting away the wall on the inside. This needs to be looked at and made right, before it causes more damage. They also need new light fixtures installed.

The urinal in the men's bathroom needs new fixtures. It leaks and does not flush properly.

The men need to clean their sheds and throw out things they do not need or use any more.

As the saying goes," If you have not used an item or do not have a use for it throw it out." Get organized.

The new blocks were purchased for the new electrical sign; they still need to be put in place so this project can be completed.

These are just a few things that need to be done and I'm sure there will be many more added to our list. It looks like 2019 is off to a good start.

One of the most important things is the Property Group needs volunteers on Friday mornings to help. For many hands make for lighter work. So, come and enjoy working on the Lords House. You will be greatly enriched by doing so. If you cannot make it on a Friday then perhaps, we can change our work days to Saturday morning. But we desperately need help.
