<u>Bible Study</u>: Let Us Pray (3-sessions) Session one: The paradoxes of prayer.

In prayer we call upon a God who may respond in unexpected ways.

Called to pray, but for what purpose? Can we persuade God with prayer? Do we actually encounter God in prayer? Is the practice of prayer intended for the sake of the one praying or for the One to whom we pray? The Bible references all of these scenarios; however, each comes with biblical, theological and practical questions. In this first session on prayer, we'll investigate the paradoxical truths of this spiritual practice.

We have enjoyed a positive busy beginning as pastor and people. Already we have around a dozen signed up for Summer Day Camp, are looking to the future in terms of replacing aging a/c units, and have many fun events planned via our fellowship committee. Our new roof is to be installed soon after this newsletter rolls out. God is up to good things at JOY Lutheran Church. And God's Holy Spirit empowers us to keep forward momentum and maintain a positive future focus.

New members have joined us on Pentecost, and we've more new members to add. In our Summer busy-ness, let us not neglect those new to our congregation. Healthy congregations are those who make intentional efforts to assist new members in very basic ways.

- 1. Invite new members to join you for lunch or coffee. Get to know one another.
- 2. Be open about your own faith journey and your own faith story. Share; just not overshare.
- 3. Explain expectations of members. Often people can't find meaningful work in the church community because they do not know what to expect or what is expected of them.
- 4. Be open about the importance of participation and tithing. Explain how and why this is important to you as a JOY member. It's great to do, every greater to know why we do what we do.
- 5. Help new members" plug-in." Give clear and detailed information on who to contact, where and when groups meet, when and where events take place, and when/how they should get started.
- 6. Orient new members about the JOY facility and function. When are the offices open? Who can use certain parts of buildings? Where are restrooms?
- 7. Each new member doesn't have a designated sponsor. Why not take on the ministry of becoming acquainted and being in contact for six months. Contact is key to building relationships. It may be a call, a mailed notecard, or an email that makes new members feel at home in JOY.

These are seven key observations that the pastor sees to help people acclimate. Feel free to add your own insights and employ them in good fashion. We want everyone to find their place in JOY. As we keep forward momentum and maintain a positive future focus, let's bring new members into the family, into the vision, so that together we effectively share God's love and grace in our corner of Palm Bay.



Rachel's Day was celebrated on May 6th, with guest speaker, Connie Schmucker, staff member with the Office of the Bishop FL-Bahamas Synod Office. Thank you for your contributions to the LOVE offering given to Turner Elementary School showing our commitment to the children in our community. The original focus of Rachel's Day was and still is shining a light on gun violence against children. Twenty years ago, the emphasis was the loss of inner city children to gang gun violence, drugs, abuse, neglect, poor education, health and hunger also contributed to the death of children. Today, children are also threatened with death by suicide, often a result of being bullied. Violence affects everyday life in homes, congregations, workplaces, schools and communities. Children can be traumatized by community violence because they are often too young or emotionally unable to process it. Commit to pray for victims and their families and encourage one another.
