Recycling Wood Project

This project's purpose is to educate youth on the importance of recycling and repurposing materials to benefit the community. An outcome of the project is the construction of birdhouses that will be displayed at The Promised Land Church.

Project started on March 27th and will end on May 1st. Project is under the direction of Joe Villescaz, CSR Specialist. In our next issue, we will cover the project's final day, including the placement of birdhouses at the church.



In the Small Engine Maintenance & Repair Service Learning Project, youth were introduced to basic skills associated with the maintenance and repair of lawn equipment. This includes tools as well as small gas engine operated equipment, specifically lawn mowers and weed trimmers.

By the end of the project, youth were able to identify and use appropriate tools, recognize different fuel sys-

tems, understand basic carburetion principles, and perform small engine tune-up and add lubrication/oil. Hands-on training was supplemented with a tour of the Aviation Hangar and Sheet Metal Shop at Alamo Community College.

This project was coordinated by Lead Specialist Joe Medellin. It culminated on Saturday, March 2nd, with a lawn mower spring tune-up at the Madonna Neighborhood Center. At this event, youth changed motor oil, replaced spark plugs, air filters, and sharpened cutting blades. Equipment serviced belonged to elderly residents who are active with Madonna. All costs (oil, spark plugs, etc.) associated with the tune-up were borne by the project.
