In the weeks after Easter, what do we do? The flowers have faded. The seasonal members have returned to their homes. The excitement and music of Easter have become a memory. Well, I have a very easy answer. We continue the mission and be the people of God!

In worship for the next month we will be surrounded by the stories of Jesus' resurrection appearances, or words that Jesus spoke before his arrest, that are to be understood in a new way because of the resurrection. Also, we will be remembering the saints in the month of May whose lives were changed because of Jesus, the crucified and risen Lord. Some of them were faithful to the end in spite of criticism, hardship, and opposition.

Here are several examples we might use in our own lives. May 1 is set aside to remember the apostles, James and Philip. Philip was the first of Jesus' disciples and he invited his brother, Nathaniel, to "Come and see" and thus began evangelism in the church. The apostle, Philip, spent his life preaching what he had seen and heard. We are told that Philip met an Ethiopian eunuch, an official in the court of Candace, queen of Ethiopia, on a deserted road between Jerusalem and Gaza. The eunuch was baptized when Philip explained to him that the "Sheep who was led to the slaughter" in Isaiah 53 was Jesus of Nazareth, the son of God.



On May 2 we remember Athanasius, Bishop of Alexandria. Athanasius was bishop of Alexandria at a time when it was dangerous to be bishop. He began his work in the church as the secretary to the then Bishop of Alexandria at the Council of Nicaea - as in the Nicene Creed. Later, he became Bishop of Alexandria himself. Athanasius was known for his defense of the full divinity of Christ against other contrary teachings supported by high ranking theologians and government officials including the emperor and the imperial family. Because of his support of what later is known as orthodoxy, he was banished from Alexandria 5 times. Eventually he was elected Bishop in his own rite. He is credited with one of the three great ecumenical creeds of the Church known as the Athanasian Creed. At a time when the New Testament was taking form, Athanasius, while he was Bishop, sent letters to the surrounding bishops suggesting which books to include in the New Testament. His list contained the 27 New Testament books which we use to this day.

On May 4 we remember Monica. You may not know the name Monica as she is not nearly as famous as her famous son, Augustine, known to history as St. Augustine (hence the city named St. Augustine). Augustine's faith, contributions and dedication to the mission of the Church were heavily influenced by Monica. Monica had married a pagan from a very pagan family. Her husband was ill-tempered and very unfaithful. But, talking about being the people of God, Monica led her husband and his mother to Jesus and they were baptized. Monica's son, Augustine, started out life very much like his father, but through the influence of his mother, he became a Christian, and a very dedicated and a very influential Christian at that. He became a bishop of the

church. His faith and his theology have influenced centuries of Christian thought and teaching. In fact, Martin Luther was an Augustinian monk, and as such, was heavily influenced by St. Augustine.

I am sorry. El Cinco de Mayo does not make the ecumenical calendar. I could go on with stories of Julian of Norwich, or Nicolas Ludwig von Zinzendorf, but the point is after Easter the mission doesn't end, it only begins. The question is, what is your mission?

ROUND ROBIN – DO OVER



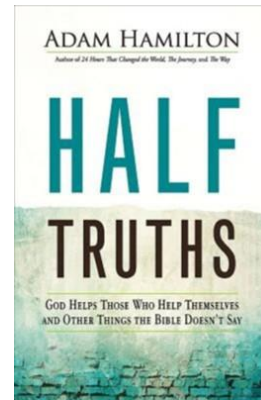

Ascension Day

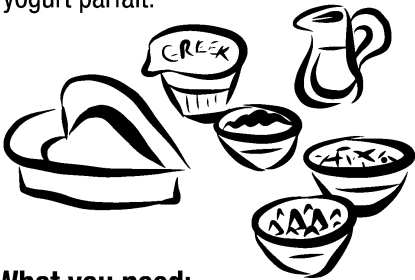
