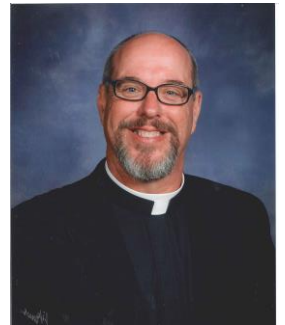
Pastor's Page

I am recovering the claim that Jesus was not crucified in a cathedral between two candles, but on a cross between two thieves; on the town garbage heap; at a crossroad so cosmopolitan that they had to write His title in Hebrew and in Latin and in Greek ... at the kind of a place where cynics talk smut, and thieves curse, and soldiers gamble. Because that is where He died. And that is what He died about. And that is where [we] should be and what [we] should be about."

With so much discussion about politics these days, and so much said about the Social Gospel, and so very many organizations striving to offer assistance to those in need, it is worthwhile pausing for a little reorientation. In more basic terms, and as a 1980s wall poster once put it: When you're up to you neck in alligators, it's difficult to remember that your original intention was to drain the swamp! Quite so.



The quotation above comes from George MacLeod, a Scottish minister who served many years at Govan Old Parish Church in Glasgow, an area of immense deprivation. From that crucible, came this quotation. In the squalor of his parish, MacLeod discovered Calvary. In the suffering and deprivation of his parishioners, he saw Jesus' suffering. In the faces of those who turned away from such suffering, he saw those who had abandoned and betrayed the Christ. It was in such a place that Jesus died. It was for such people Jesus suffered. In was for such communities (indeed, for the whole world!) that the Saviour died. And there, where people live lives of quiet desperation, the life-giving Gospel was to be proclaimed, and taught and lived. (Or, as MacLeod put it, there the "cross must be raised again.")

That is what we are about as a community of faith, grounded in the Word. Indeed, that is what we "bring to the table" that no one else does. That is the unique gift we possess; the treasure that we earthen vessels contain. Along with water, and bread, and clothes, and community (the gifts described in Matthew 25) we bring the good news of God in Christ Jesus. The gift of hope, and love. We are vessels of forgiving, abundant grace. We share the Water of Life that ends thirst, and the Bread of Life that ends hunger. And we share these things even as we share life-sustaining water and bread. In short, we believe in life after death *and* life before death.

Our ministry of service is unique because of the very One who sends us. It is unique because of what He accomplished through (and sometimes despite!) us. This is not a Social Gospel: It is *the* Gospel. And, it comes to life, and bestows life, "at the kind of a place where cynics talk smut, and thieves curse, and soldiers gamble. Because that is where He died. And that is what He died about. And that is where [we] should be and what [we] should be about."

two requests, both of which were approved:

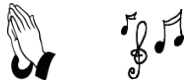

Raíja's Meringue Cake

Ingredients for Cake:

3 egg yolks
1/2 (just under) cup of sugar
1 1/3 sticks of butter (melted)
2/3 cup of flour
1/4 cup of cream or milk
2 tsp of baking powder

Ingredients for Meringue:

3 egg whites
3/4 (just under) cup of sugar
1 tsp of vanilla extract
(some flaked almonds)

Ingredients for Filling:

1 1/2 cup of whipping cream
1 (28-30 oz) can of sliced peaches [or other fruit]
- do not use the juice!

Preparation:

(1) Cake-Mix-Paste

First mix the ingredients for the cake. Start by beating the 3 egg-yolks and the 1/2 cup of sugar thoroughly to a foam. Add the 1/4 cup of cream (or milk), the 2/3 cup of melted butter and, finally, the flour mixed with the baking powder. Beat until all lumps disappear. Line a cookie sheet with greased parchment paper. Spread the paste on the greased paper.

(2) Meringue

Beat the egg-whites hard and carefully. Stir in the 3/4 cup of sugar and the vanilla-extract.

(3) Spread the meringue mix on top of the cake-paste. (Then - If you are not allergic to almonds - put some almond flakes on top of the meringue spread.)

(4) Preheat oven to 400F. Bake Cake Meringue for 5 min. Then, turn down the heat to 330F and bake for another 20 min more.

(5) When the meringue-cake is ready, take it out from the oven. Let it cool for a short while. Then cut the cake into two halves and place one half (meringue down) on a serving dish. Whip

the cream and spread it on the - now cool - turned over half of the cake. Slice the peaches and put the slices on top of the cream. Put the remaining half of the cake (meringue up) on top of the whipped cream and the peaches.

The cake tastes better if you let it cool in the refrigerator a couple of hours before serving.

The beginning of Father's Day

One Sunday in 1909, a young woman named Sonora Smart Dodd sat in a pew listening to a sermon honoring mothers. Her mother had died some years before, so her father had raised her by himself. She began to wonder why there wasn't a day to honor fathers.






Sonora decided to arrange for a tribute to be paid to her father at a church in her hometown of Spokane, Washington. The date was June 19, 1910. Many believe that this was the beginning of Father's Day.

Another view is that Dr. Robert Webb, pastor of Central Church, in Fairmont, West Virginia, held a service giving tribute to fathers in 1908. Regardless of which story is the correct one, it is certain that President Calvin Coolidge was the first president to choose a special day to honor fathers. He proclaimed the third Sunday in June as Father's Day in 1924.

What you do:

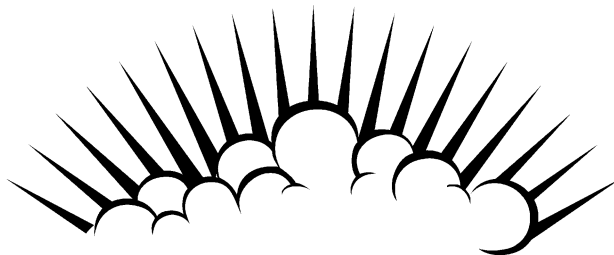
1. Place paint on the paper plate.

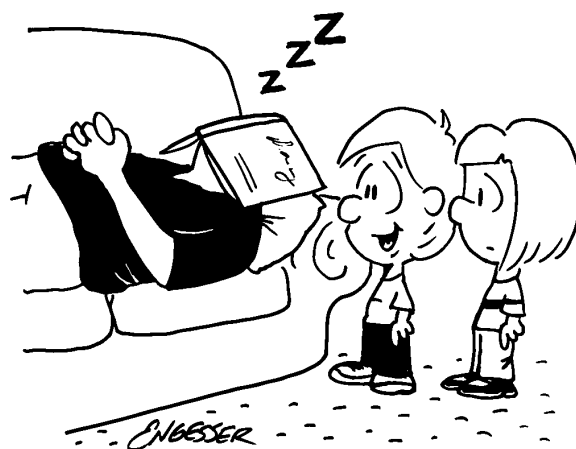
