<u>Conflict | Gossip | Forgiveness</u>

Matthew 18:15-22

[Jesus Said] ¹⁵"If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. ¹⁶But if you are

not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. ¹⁷If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. ¹⁸Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. ¹⁹Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. ²⁰For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."



²¹Then Peter came and said to him, "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, <u>how</u> <u>often should I forgive?</u> As many as seven times?" ²²Jesus said to him, "<u>Not seven times, but, I tell</u> <u>you, seventy-seven times.</u>

There is nothing that can destroy a church faster than gossip. There will always be conflict and there should always be forgiveness; however when gossip gets in the middle of the conflict, forgiveness could never take place. The Bible gives us specific instructions as to how to handle conflict. Jesus said that when someone sins against you, go to that person and talk about the hurt when the two of you are alone. The thing NOT to do is go to someone else and complain about that person to another. When that is done, the cancer of gossip starts to spread and starts to eat away at a congregation's health. If the person who is doing the complaining finds someone who will listen and empathize the cancer gets stronger. If the one who is listening stops the conversation by saying, "You need to speak to whoever it is that has offended you," then the cancer will not have a chance to grow and spread, but if anyone gives ear to gossip, even in the name of friendship, it will help the cancer of gossip grow and destroy the church.

If step one in Matthew 18 does not work, then Jesus goes on to give further instructions to confront with witnesses. If that even fails then go tell the church and if that even fails then that person is to

be treated as a Gentile or a tax collector. In other words "Sinners" or "Outsiders". Then Peter comes up with a question that sums up Jesus' whole reason for the mini sermon on conflict. You see Peter knew that Jesus forgave the Tax Collectors and welcomed the Gentiles. So Peter asked, "<u>How often</u> <u>should I forgive?</u> As many as seven times?" And Peter thought he was being slick, coming up with this extravagant number 7. Jesus came back with not seven times but I tell you seventy-seven times. So the ultimate message Jesus is giving us here is to first try to straighten things out with your sister or brother in Christ <u>without gossiping</u> and if all else fails FORGIVE as you have been forgiven.

Remember folks we are all the body of Christ. When one member suffers, we all suffer. It doesn't make sense to have ill feelings toward any other member of our body. Pray for those who hurt you and then follow the instructions in Matthew 18.

Fellowship

OFFEE HOUR: Starting **February 4**, **2018**, there will be one coffee hour between services. It will be a nice opportunity to get to know those attending a different service. We also need volunteers to sign up to bring in finger-type food items.

LENTEN SOUP SUPPERS: Prior to Lenten Services on Wednesdays, we will gather for a soup supper at 6 pm in the fellowship hall. Get out your soup recipes and bring them along to share on February 21st, 28th, and March 7th, 14th, and 21st. We will not host a supper during Holy Week.

Preparing soup, serving and cleaning up is open to anyone attending Good Shepherd or a committee/ministry may work as a team. In addition to the soups and bread, coffee and cold drinks will be served. Expect to arrive at 5 pm to prepare the coffee, arrange the soups, bowls, spoons, napkins, and mix the cold drinks.

Groups or individuals are asked to sign up for one or more of the Wednesday suppers. The sign-up sheets can be found in the activity rack in the narthex. Thank you for sharing this meal with your church family.

- where you live and your destination so I can find the driver closest to you.

3) Your driver will call you to confirm your request.

What this program does **NOT** do:
