reetings in the name of our risen Lord, Jesus. Wow, it is October already! October means many things to many people. We are in the midst of football season. School is in full swing. Seasonal residents are beginning to return to the area. The days are getting shorter. Things are beginning to change.

Those are some of the things I sat and pondered as I sat and pondered what to write for this newsletter. And, just in case you do not already know, writing newsletter articles does not come easily to me. I sat and sat and started to doodle on the piece of paper on which I was writing notes to myself for this article. Somehow I scratched a prayer using OCTOBER as an acronym. This is a prayer I say often. Today it became an acronym. It looked something like this:

Open my eyes Lord and

Create in me a clean heart.


Teach me your ways

Order my life.

Be near me always and

Encircle me with your presence.

Reassure me that your love and mercy are constant.



Prayers can be said and done anywhere, anytime, in any form. Prayers can be silent, or said out loud, formed or impromptu, spoken or sung as a hymn. I found myself in prayer when I wrote the word October.

There is another more popular acronym. It is a popular acronym that you may have seen before. I did not make this one up. It uses the word "joy." It is as follows:

Jesus

Others

You.

Notice what comes first. Jesus is to be first, others second, and yourself last. Joy is one of God's greatest gifts to us, and it frequently comes to us as a result of following these priorities.

Our Stewardship Campaign for this year will begin this month. Our theme "Empowered by Grace," focuses on the joy that comes from living in God's love and reflecting that love to others by being faithful and fruitful stewards for Jesus.

Why are we left with such a joyful feeling when we give generous financial gifts to our church or to someone in need or when we give freely of our time in service to others? Isn't the ability to give and the joy in doing so both gifts of God? The Apostle Paul, admonishing his hearers to "help the weak" also reminded

them that Jesus himself said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35). Outside a relationship with Jesus, we may not find his words to be true, but, as followers of Jesus, and as we abide in him, we bear fruit ... the fruit of giving, serving, helping, and loving those he places around us even as he has given, served, helped, and loved us. These things he tells us; he said, "That my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete." (John 15:11).

Through the giving of our time and money, we experience one of the true joys of being Christians. God certainly doesn't need our gifts, but God does ask us to give of ourselves and our blessings. God accepts and uses them and gives us joy in sharing them. As we respond to God's love for us by giving back to him part of what our God has given to us, he reacts by giving us even more. "Give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measured you get back." (Luke 6:38).

Although we don't give and serve so that we will receive God's blessings, God's Word promises us that, when we do things in Jesus' name faithfully and willingly, we will receive an abundance of spiritual blessings and, sometimes, material blessings as well.

Through faith, we realize that the joy that comes from the world is not lasting nor does it satisfy. Our pursuit of joy culminates in the discovery that, by God's grace, we receive joy not from serving ourselves, but from helping others. So, let's go spread some JOY!

"Empowered by Grace"

STEWARDSHIP IS FAITH IN ACTION.

"This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy" (1 Corinthians 4:1-2).



e are entering into our annual stewardship emphasis entitled, "*Empowered by Grace*." During the next few weeks, we will consider what it means to be a "faithful steward empowered by grace" and how our stewardship translates into practical Christianity.

This emphasis is built in its entirety on two concepts: First, God owns everything! As Psalm 24:1 states clearly, "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it." God owns it all and has never relinquished the title deed to the world. Second, our responsibility is to manage that which belongs to God and which God has entrusted to us. In other words, all that we have is a blessing from God and represents that which God has loaned to us on a temporary basis.

What kinds of things belong to God? Certainly our time is a gift from our Heavenly Father that is given to everyone equally. All of us have the same amount of time — 24 hours per day. How we use our time is what makes the difference for this life and for eternity. Some will squander their time by giving priority to activities that carry little impact for eternity. Others will invest their time wisely for God's glory and for the good of others.

Our talents are also gifts on loan from God. Not everyone receives an equal amount of talents or abilities, nor do we have the same talents and abilities, but all of us can excel at something. Some are called to a public ministry whereby what they do is highly visible, including pastors, worship leaders and teachers. Others are called to a less visible role in the ministry and work of the church. But all of us are given talents and abilities which can be used for God's glory and to strengthen the gospel outreach here at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church.

The question is not *whether* we *can* do something for the Lord. The question is *if* we *will* use our talents and abilities to serve God. Unfortunately, many times, we offer excuses to avoid serving the Lord, excuses that often appear humorous when applied to other activities. *Moody Monthly* once carried an article that illustrated excuses people might use for not attending sports events. The analogy is easy to make in terms of serving the Lord.

Every time I went, they asked me for money. The people with whom I had to sit didn't seem very friendly. The seats were too hard and not comfortable. The coach never came to call on me. The referee made some decisions with which I could not agree. I was sitting with some hypocrites — they only came to see what others were wearing. Some games went into overtime, and I was late getting home. The band played numbers that I had never heard before. The games are scheduled when I want to do other things. My parents took me to too many games when I was growing up. Since I read a book on sports, I feel that I know more than the coaches anyhow. I don't want to take my children because I want them to choose for themselves which sport they like best.

On the second day of their conference at Yalta, Premier Stalin gave President Roosevelt a reason why a proposed plan would not work. Roosevelt gently reminded Stalin that this was not the same reason he had given the previous day. Stalin replied, "My dear Roosevelt, whenever you don't want to do something, one excuse is as good as another."

Stop and think about it: 80% of the work in most congregations (including our congregation) is done by 20% of the people. The rest have made other activities a priority for their time and talents.

As one of the faithful stewards "Empowered by Grace" here at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, will you go against that trend by making a commitment to the "Proprietor of the Universe" to use the time and talents that have been given to you to make a difference in the ministry and outreach of our congregation? Remember, as one of those to whom God has entrusted time, talents and treasure, God is counting on you. . . .

The Quilting Group


n September 4th seven quilters and one sewer met and we finished seven quilts.


This portable snack combines favorite fall flavors.



- 1/4 cup maple syrup
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- 1/8 tsp. salt
- ²/₃ cup pecan pieces
- 1/3 cup roasted pumpkin seeds
- 1/3 cup almonds
- 1/4 cup raisins
- ²/₃ cup dried fruit (any)

What you do:

- 1. Microwave syrup, spices, seeds and nuts for 30 seconds at a time, stirring frequently, until mixture thickens.

- 3. Break the candied nuts into chunks. Combine with dried fruit.
