The Spring Road Clean Up will commence on Saturday May 9th at 9:00 am. As always we will gather at the junction of Shadywood Shores Drive and Hwy 49 and disperse from there. Be mindful of the weather and dress appropriately. Be aware that the ditches can be wet so you will want boots and gloves. Bring a garbage bag or pail for your collections.

A Directors Board Meeting will be held immediately after completing the road clean up. The meeting place is yet to be established. At this meeting we set the agenda for the general meeting and discuss the general direction of the association for the remainder of the year. All association members are welcome to attend.

Zebra mussels confirmed in Cass Lake. A September 12 DNR news release reports that Zebra mussels have been confirmed in Cass Lake located in Cass County in northwestern Minnesota. Cass Lake will be designated as zebra mussel infested as will Buck Lake, Andrusia Lake, Wolf Lake, Pike Bay, Pug

General Meeting Presentation

Test netting and fish inventorying of Hay Lake was completed last summer and the same was completed for Hand Lake the summer before.

Natural Resource Specialist Bill Evarts will be presenting at our Spring annual general meeting. He will provide the results of the test nettings and how we might best maintain our lakes. It should be an informative presentation. You will not want to miss this.

Hole Lake, Kitchi Lake, Little Rice Lake and Big Rice Lake and their respective connecting rivers will also be designated as zebra mussel infested. While no zebra mussels have been found in these lakes, they are heavily used by boaters traveling from Cass Lake. This is the first confirmed adult zebra mussel find in the Bemidji area.

Take the test. The MNDNR offers a comprehensive on-line course in boating. The Boat Minnesota Course features easy-to-understand boating safety instructions and hundreds of detailed illustrations to help you improve your boating skills and become a better, more prepared operator. Complete the study then head on over and take the test. You can take the test as many times as you like. After passing you will received a life time Boater Education Certificate. It is all free, of course. Boater education is not required in Minnesota; however young adults 12-17 operating a motor boat with engines larger than 25 horse must have the Watercraft Operators Permit.
